The Rotary Club of Lahaina Sunset, with funding from Maui County, partnerships with Malama Maui Nui and local business 5A Rent a Space, began the program in July. Held monthly at Lahaina Cannery Mall parking lot, the project has collected over 69,000 pounds of scrap metal and recyclable materials. The e-waste, including televisions and computers has been equally impressive with over 1,000 pieces collected in eight months.




If you would like photos of how bad this is I can resend them to you as I have sent them in the past.

Aloha Council Members,

I respectfully ask that you include funding for the Go Green Third Saturday Recycling Program in Lahaina in the upcoming fiscal year budget.

You may not be familiar with the small but mighty Rotary Club of Lahaina Sunset. We are a group of westside leaders who assembled officially just over a year and a half ago. With a focus on community service, we set our sights on taking action to "Go Green and Keep Our Island Clean". With funding from Maui County, we partnered with Malama Maui Nui to launch a monthly recycling program for westside residents. Beginning last July, we've held a recycling event at the convenient Lahaina Cannery Mall parking lot from 8 am — noon on the third Saturday of the month. We collect general recyclables (e.g., aluminum cans, plastic bottles, newspaper, cardboard, glass bottles) along with more significant recyclables like appliances and scrap metal.

I'd like to share with you some results from this program. In the first 8 months of the program, we've recycled over:

- 400 Household appliances, including 140 refrigerators and 87 air conditioners
- 51,000 pounds of scrap metal
- 17,000 pounds of general recyclables
- 3,000 batteries and
- 1,000 pieces of e-waste, like old televisions and computers

We know that these recyclables have been sitting in community members' homes, in their yards and in some cases on neighborhood streets, in our valleys and over cliffs. We are working hard to remove this waste from our community and avoid the landfill.

The success of this recycling program is due to our dedicated volunteers, solid community partnerships and critical funding from Maui County. The Go Green Third Saturday Recycling Program is making a difference in West Maui. Thank you for your ongoing support of this program.
