Dear Chair Hokama and Committee Members:

The American Red Cross of Hawaii requests your support in appropriating \$25,000 of FY2017-2018 County funding to support our Disaster Preparedness & Response Program in the County of Maui. Since its founding, the Red Cross has been the nation's premier emergency response organization, and the Red Cross is committed to helping people through the entire disaster cycle—preparedness, response and recovery. Each year, the American Red Cross of Hawaii delivers help, hope and healing to people affected by disasters by transforming donors' generous funding into shelter, food and emotional support. Twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, the Red Cross assists victims of house and apartment fires, floods and other natural or man-made disasters.

The mission of the Red Cross is to prevent and alleviate human suffering in the face of emergencies by mobilizing the power of volunteers and the generosity of donors. Founded in 1917, the Hawaii Red Cross has assisted victims of every major disaster in the island's history, including the: bombing of Pearl Harbor, Hilo tsunami, volcanic eruptions, Big Isle earthquake, Hurricanes Iwa, Iniki and Iselle, New Year's & Manoa floods, Kaloko Dam burst, Sacred Falls landslide, Xerox shooting, air transportation crashes, and hostage situations. The Red Cross fulfills its humanitarian mission by coming to the aid of disaster victims, teaching people how to save lives, and providing emergency communication between deployed military service members and their families in times of crisis.

Although the Red Cross is not a government agency, it is mandated by Congress to provide disaster relief assistance. This is an unfunded responsibility that stipulates the American Red Cross must provide emergency mass care and assistance for individuals with urgent and verified disaster-caused needs. The Red Cross is also designated as the lead primary organization by all Counties to plan and execute disaster shelter operations. In August 2015, the Red Cross signed an agreement with FEMA that renewed the Red Cross' role through 2020, as the co-lead for provision of mass care under the National Response Framework, along with the Department of

Homeland Security/FEMA. As a co-lead, the Red Cross is responsible for fulfilling the mass care portion of Emergency Support Function 6 (ESF-6), to include feeding, sheltering, bulk distribution and family reunification. The Red Cross continues to be a support agency to the other components of ESF-6, which includes Emergency Assistance, Housing and Human Services. In addition, the agreement was expanded to ensure the partnership covered the entire disaster cycle—preparedness, response and recovery.

The Disaster Preparedness and Response Program address both our humanitarian mission and our federal mandate. This mission is to ensure that victims of disasters have a safe place to stay, food to eat, assistance or referrals to help replace essential items, and support from trained professionals to aid in recovery planning. In a major disaster, crisis counseling, sheltering, feeding, disaster welfare information, emergency first aid and other support services are also provided to those affected. In preparation for a major disaster, the following are ongoing Red Cross efforts:

- Identifying necessary supplies, equipment, staff and volunteers to better serve vulnerable populations and at-risk communities;
- Developing preparedness strategies for diverse communities, including multilingual educational materials;
- Signing sheltering agreements with large capacity facilities;
- Forging agreements with large-scale food distributors and developing plans for both mobile and bulk distribution of food;
- Strategically pre-positioning disaster relief supplies across the state; and
- Participating in disaster preparedness drills with community partners to assess readiness.

The goals of our Disaster Preparedness and Response Program are twofold: 1) to recruit, train, and coordinate volunteers to be on call to provide disaster relief assistance to victims of disasters big and small, anytime, anywhere throughout the state; 2) to provide individuals, families, schools, businesses and communities with knowledge and skills to better prepare themselves and others before emergencies occur. We respond every four days to disasters here in Hawaii, and our immediate and compassionate services reduce the harsh physical and emotional distress that prevents people from meeting their own basic needs following a disaster.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, from 2010 to 2014, 13.1% of Maui County's population lived below the poverty level. Our records indicate that in FY15, at least 19% of the disaster families the American Red Cross of Hawaii served statewide were below the poverty guidelines set by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development. This poor and needy population is particularly vulnerable to disasters and is dependent on Red Cross services when affected by a disaster. The Red Cross serves as a safety net for victims of every day disasters who have nowhere else to turn. Following our principle of impartiality, all Red Cross disaster services are available free of charge to anyone in the state of Hawaii who falls victim to natural and man-made disasters.

During FY16 (7/1/15 – 6/30/16), the Maui Red Cross delivered help, hope and healing to the people of Maui County: we responded to 14 incidents and assisted 45 individuals with their immediate emergency needs. We shared vital disaster preparedness information via community disaster education outreach with 2,703 individuals, including children who through the Pillowcase Project learned about disaster preparedness, coping skills and the science behind disasters. We issued 104 disaster training certificates, and we currently have 151 trained and active disaster volunteers in Maui County equipped to assist with disaster relief efforts. Through the Home Fire Campaign we visited 28 homes and installed 78 smoke alarms and helped residents formulate their fire safety plan to prevent and prepare for the most common disaster – a home fire; in total, we reached 86 people through this campaign.

Response is only the tip of the spear. It takes preparation, resources and infrastructure to be able to respond everyday throughout the year. We accomplish this with a small staff and hundreds of volunteers who work 12-hour shifts, morning, noon and night. Volunteers need to be recruited beforehand and trained, put on call and deployed at a moment's notice whenever there is a disaster. Maintaining a large volunteer workforce requires resources for recruitment, screening, training and retention. To ensure quality and consistency of service, volunteers require supervision and coordination. Your support will provide the Red Cross with the resources required to galvanize, train and support a robust disaster volunteer force.

Since disasters impact entire communities, effective disaster preparedness requires the involvements of everyone in the area. The geographic remoteness of the Hawaiian Islands makes community preparedness and resiliency not only relevant, but vital. Following a major disaster, our logistics bridge could become compromised and critical resupply of items such as fuel, food and medical supplies could be delayed for weeks. Today, emergency management experts believe preparing is only part of the solution. Experts now emphasize the importance of resilience, which is the ability for a community to not just survive, but to adapt and bounce back. Time and again, we have seen that well-prepared communities fare better following disasters: more lives are saved, less money is required for recovery and everyone stabilizes more quickly when a community is resilient (*Disaster Resilience: A National Imperative*, National Research Council, Washington D.C.: National Academies Press, 2012). Every dollar invested in pre-disaster preparedness and risk reduction activities saves over \$4 in post-disaster response and recovery expenses (Multihazard Mitigation Council 2005).

On Maui, we have collaborative relationships on disaster response with all levels of government, military, and non-governmental organizations, such as the Maui Police Department, Fire Department, and Civil Defense. Red Cross Maui County Director Michele Liberty reports directly to the Red Cross Regional Disaster Officer, Maria Lutz, located at the Hawaii Red Cross headquarters on Oahu. The direct support of the state and national Red Cross, coupled with the close working relationship of our volunteer leadership, ensure Ms. Liberty has a clear channel for communications and support, while also having the autonomy to serve Maui County in emergency preparedness and response.

Here is the dilemma. Most funders want to donate money to buy tangible items like cots and blankets, but don't think about the cost to rent space to store the cots, or how the cots and blankets will get transported to shelters when needed. County of Maui funding would help support the basic infrastructure of the Red Cross Disaster Preparedness & Response Program so the Maui Red Cross is able to respond and prepare the community beforehand to mitigate the loss of life and property. The goals of the Red Cross Disaster Preparedness & Response Program on Maui County complement those of Maui Civil Defense and benefit Maui County and its people.

If granted, funding would be used to train volunteer disaster responders and share disaster preparedness information through community disaster education outreach. Specifically, it would support the partial salary and benefits of our only paid staff person in Maui County. This expense is necessary and directly related to our disaster preparedness and response efforts in Maui County. Whether a disaster happens or not, the Red Cross must constantly recruit and train volunteers to be ready to respond and educate the community about disaster preparedness. Without support of these fixed costs, we couldn't operate and would not be able to respond when needed and would not be able to train as many volunteers.

Our sole staff person on Maui County is Ms. Liberty, whose primary responsibility (85% of her time) is to implement our Disaster Preparedness and Response Program in Maui County, including Molokai and Lanai. Ms. Liberty's internal organizational title is Disaster Program Manager, but since she serves as the face of the Red Cross on Maui, her external title is Maui County Director. This position does not handle administrative duties, such as accounting, fundraising, IT, HR, or communications. Rather, these functions are handled by headquarters staff on Oahu and as such are not included in this funding request.

Ms. Liberty coordinates all facets of the Disaster Preparedness & Response Program for Maui County. She recruits volunteers, schedules their training, arranges for volunteer instructors to conduct courses, works with volunteers to secure, inventory, and pre-position disaster supplies, and ensures that volunteers are mobilized to help disaster victims anytime and anywhere in Maui County. She also organizes volunteers to conduct community disaster education outreach, engages the community in disaster preparedness planning, and works with government agencies and other non-profit organizations to plan and exercise for disasters. All of these duties entail direct program (not administrative) expenses.

Ms. Liberty has served in this position since November 2009, and is familiar with Maui County and its needs. She has a number of long-time disaster volunteers who are experienced and knowledgeable about responding to disasters in Maui County and who have deployed to disasters outside of Hawaii to gain invaluable experience to be used when the next major disaster strikes our islands. Even volunteers from Molokai and Lanai have deployed to the mainland because each island will have to stand on its own until outside help can arrive. Ms. Liberty works in cooperation with the volunteer leadership in Maui County to recruit and retain volunteers, oversee the program, and set an example of a strong paid and volunteer partnership.

Having volunteers play such a vital role in carrying out our mission makes the Red Cross unique. Whereas other organizations might pay for drug counselors or child care workers to provide services, we leverage the free services of Red Cross volunteers to fulfill our mission. Just as the County would fund contracts/salaries of drug counselors or child care workers as a program expense, the salary of our Red Cross staff person, who enables us to use volunteers to provide services, is a program expense. The fact that we don't have to pay our volunteers to do the work demonstrates the Red Cross is indeed, a very wise investment.

For the past 100 years, the Hawaii Red Cross has helped Hawaii families and communities build their capacity to be ready for emergencies and respond to disasters. We really need and appreciate the County of Maui's help to fund our vital Disaster Preparedness & Response Program in Maui County, and humbly ask for your continued support. On behalf of Lana`i Community Health Center (LCHC), I would like to thank the County of Maui, Mayor, and Council for continued support of LCHC's programs. For the past several years, our Health Center has been the recipient of a Line Item Award. These funds have made it possible for LCHC to provide services to all community members seeking health care, especially the un- and under-insured. Most recently, Line Item funds have been used to support our behavioral health program by providing support for our clinical psychologist's salary—leveraging funds we have received from insurance payments and more recently a federal grant. Our behavioral health program continues to be heavily utilized by community members, both LCHC patients as well as others, since we provide the only such services on island. A number of our patients do not have coverage for behavioral health services — or the annual number of visits is severely limited, thereby making County funding a critical component of our program.

Our request for FY2018 is to once again provide funding for our Behavioral Health Program — paying for direct services — a portion of our psychologist's compensation. In addition to providing psychological counseling, our psychologist also supports our medical providers by providing integrated behavioral health services. We respectfully request that funding be maintained at our current level - \$82,610.

A. Project Summary

a. Performance Period

The performance period for this Project is January 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017.

b. Project Description

The 2017 Lānaʻi - Building Strength Project is intended to strengthen both the Chamber and Community by:

1. Continuing Fifth Friday Lānaʻi, a community wide event held every fifth Friday whose purpose is to increase traffic for local businesses, attract visitors to Lānaʻi, highlight local entertainment with an emphasis on showcasing the arts, food and music.
2. Enabling the Chamber to complete creation/update & maintain 5 websites:
 - i. lanaichamber.com
 - ii. fifthfridaylanai.com
 - iii. movingtolanai.com
 - iv. lanaibusinessdirectory.com
 - v. lanaicalendar.com

These sites will raise awareness of the Chamber, promote Lānaʻi, provide information for chamber members, community, visitors and will generate revenue for the Chamber through the sale of ads, listings and sponsorships.

3. Enabling the Chamber, along with the participation of local businesses, to create a public WIFI mesh network around Dole Park. This should increase foot traffic for the business, benefit residents & visitors and generate revenue for the Chamber through the sale of ads, listings and sponsorships.
4. Providing a travel stipend for Chamber Directors. Hawaiʻi is an island state and Maui County is made up of three separate inhabited islands. This separation by water represents a barrier to networking and connecting Lānaʻi to outside resources. Chamber Directors have been solely responsible for their travel costs. This stipend will alleviate that barrier and to a degree that burden while encourage networking and connecting Lānaʻi to additional resources.

5. Providing seed funding for Chamber Member, Community Development, Organizational & Educational Programs or Meetings. Such as:
 - i. Small Business Breakfast Program
 - ii. 'Ohina Short Film Showcase Project with LHES
 - iii. Workshops with MEO and MEDB
 - iv. Business Networking & Social Events
6. Providing funding for the filming and production of a series of videos promoting local businesses and highlighting Lāna'i. These videos will be shared as "content" on the Chamber's websites, social media and be made available for local businesses to use for promotion.

c. Discussion

The 2017 Lāna'i - Building Strength Project consists of six components. The first component, which has received prior OED grant funding, is the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event.

The Lāna'i Chamber of Commerce created Fifth Friday Lāna'i as a fun and interactive way to highlight local small businesses, generate foot traffic for those businesses and create a family-friendly event that celebrates life on Lāna'i. The event, which is now part of Maui Friday's, is open to all ages and encourages participation from both visitors and the local community. The Lāna'i Chamber of Commerce will host Fifth Friday events in each month that has a fifth Friday.

The inaugural Fifth Friday was held on August 29, 2014. There are four fifth Fridays in 2017 occurring on March 31, 2017, June 30, 2017, September 29, 2017 and December 29, 2017.

The Lāna'i Chamber of Commerce, Fifth Friday Event Coordinator and its volunteers provide the organizational framework for the event. Including enrolling member businesses, scheduling and booking of entertainment and event promotion through the sale of event cards, that provide for discounts and promotions at the participating businesses.

The new components of the 2017 Lāna'i - Building Strength Project are:

1. Web Site Development, Deployment & Maintenance.
2. Deploy public WIFI mesh network around Dole Park.
3. Travel Stipend – Chamber Directors.
4. Seed Funding for Chamber Member & Community Development, Organizational & Educational Programs or Meetings.
5. Produce series of Videos – Promoting local businesses and highlighting Lāna'i.

These components are intended to strengthen the Chamber by supporting and expanding its capacity to deliver tangible benefit to local businesses, the community and visitors.

Websites are the modern day equivalent of the "OPEN" sign and are a cost effective platform to share information with anyone in the world 24/7. The Grant will enable the Chamber to:

1. Complete updates to its existing lanaichamber.com and fifthfridaylanai.com websites.
2. Develop and deploy movingtolanai.com. An online resource guide for those moving to Lāna'i or looking for employment on Lāna'i. There are no existing websites dedicated to providing this information. This site will support recruitment efforts of the resort and benefit all by connecting new residents with the Chamber and Community. Hopefully aiding with retention of new residents.
3. Develop and deploy lanaicalendar.com and lanaibusinessdirectory.com. There are no websites dedicated to providing "live" calendar and directory information for Lāna'i.
4. Provide for one year of maintenance, hosting and software licensing.
5. Each of the websites will provide the Chamber with additional opportunity to increase revenue by selling ads, listings and sponsorships.

The website component of the project will be overseen by the Chamber's Executive Committee, which consists of its Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. It is expected that Chair Brad Bunn will, with Board approval, continue the update and rollout of the websites, including, hosting, maintenance and software licensing.

Providing access to the "world wide web" via a public WIFI mesh network is more than an amenity to guests or customers. It is a necessary ingredient for the success of rural communities, like Lāna'i, because many residents and students do not have access to the internet outside of their work or school.

A mesh WIFI network, like the one that will be deployed, literally forms a "mesh" of interconnected wireless nodes. The "mesh" automatically adjusts if one node goes down and as new nodes are added. Management software will allow for the remote management of both the network and web content filtering.

The public WIFI mesh network component of the project will be overseen by the Chamber's Executive Committee, which consists of its Chair, Treasurer and Secretary. It is expected that Chair Brad Bunn will, with Board approval, spearhead the purchase of hardware, its deployment and provide maintenance and filtering software licensing.

The third new component of this application is a stipend for Chamber Director travel expenses. As discussed previously, Chamber Directors have been solely responsible for their travel costs for Chamber business. This stipend will mitigate some of that burden while encouraging networking and connecting Lāna'i to additional resources.

Component number four is seed money to support additional organizational and educational meetings and programs. This will allow the Chamber to resurrect the Small Business Breakfast Programs that featured speakers from off island and to pursue a joint program with LHES and 'Ohina. Working together with the Chamber 'Ohina will send volunteers to Lāna'i who are professionals in media/film/production to work with LHES students on the creation of short films to be shown in Honolulu and Lāna'i as part of their Short Film Showcase. A secondary goal is to expose and connect the students to career paths in media & film and to a professional support/mentoring network. This component of the project will be overseen by the Chamber's Executive Committee, which consists of its Chair, Treasurer and Secretary.

The fifth and final new component of this application is funding that would allow the Chamber to create a series of videos promoting local businesses and highlighting Lāna'i. These videos will be developed in cooperation with Lāna'i based Anthony Pacheco/ Kekulamamo Company, LLC. This component of the project will be overseen by the Chamber's Executive Committee, which consists of its Chair, Treasurer and Secretary.

The Lana'i Chamber of Commerce is utilizing Tri-Isle as its fiscal sponsor and the fiscal sponsor for the event.

Maui County should provide funding for this project in order to enable the Lana'i Chamber of Commerce to strengthen its organization, the community and promote the Island of Lāna'i while increasing economic activity for Lāna'i's small businesses. Funding will assist the Chamber in reaching its goal of creating programs and events under the umbrella of a sustainable Chamber organization that promotes business activity on Lāna'i while strengthening the local community.

B. Introduction

Fifth Friday Lāna'i is a program of the Lana'i Chamber of Commerce. The Lāna'i Chamber of Commerce is currently composed of 80+ businesses and individual members. The objectives of this organization are:

- I. Procure and encourage adaptation and implementation of laws and regulations desirable for the benefit of business in general, and provide for a forum for the reflection of the sentiments of business regarding matters affecting its interests; □
- II. Preserve the competitive enterprise system of business by creating a better understanding and appreciation of the importance of the business community and a concern for their problems; □
- III. Promote business and community growth and development by:

- A. - Designing economic programs to strengthen and expand the income potential of all businesses on Lanai;
- B. - Encouraging programs of a civic, social and cultural nature which are designed to increase the functional and aesthetic values of the community; and
- C. - Discovering and correcting abuses that prevent the promotion of business expansion and community growth.

IV. To nurture the relationship between Lanai's uniqueness, cultural and natural resources and businesses that enhance the values that set Lanai apart from most areas of the Hawaiian Islands.

The Lana'i Chamber of Commerce is governed by a Board of Directors nominated from its business members and elected by its voting members. The 2016-17 Lana'i Chamber Board of Directors are:

C. Problem/Need Target Groups

Small business on Lāna'i faces a multitude of challenges, including:

- An economy almost solely dependent on tourism.
- Small work force-limited labor market.
- High cost of transportation, shipping costs & logistics.
- Rural community isolated from markets within Hawaii, much less markets outside of the State.
- Limited commercial space available for lease & little or no property available for purchase.
- Limited housing available either for rent or purchase.
- High cost of electricity and limited high-speed internet connectivity options.
- Cost and complication of the regulatory requirements of doing business within Hawaii and dealing with agencies that work off Island out of offices on Maui or Oahu.
- Concentrated ownership of the Island, which means that the economy and opportunity for independent business development is very much subject to the owner's plans/strategy/objectives.
- The things that are working need to be supported – Lāna'i must break the cycle of an organization forming, doing good work then burning out and failing. How ?
- How does the community grow the pie, ie, we can all win by working together vs zero sum I win so everyone else must lose - everyone is fighting over the same resources?
- Lana'i has been locked in stasis for the last 25 years. What are the components, physical plant and infrastructure needed to break the cycle? What/where are the areas where progress can be made with and/or without ownership? Who are the other partners besides ownership?

Added to this are additional challenges associated with the transition of management & ownership control of the majority of the Island. Including the new owner's management team's attempts to implement the publicly announced plans of Larry Ellison. This includes the extensive renovations at Manele, its reopening and the just announced plans for permanent closure of the Ko'ele golf course. New plans for the Lodge, have also been announced, and it will now remain closed at least to the end of 2018. 2017 is going to be another tough year for local Lāna'i businesses and residents as Manele ramps up and plans for Ko'ele are finalized.

The Lāna'i Chamber of Commerce is working with its members and the community to mitigate some of the impact. The Fifth Friday Event directly supports local small businesses by generating foot traffic from residents and visitors. Increased marketing efforts by the Chamber to promote the event and activities on Lāna'i will help support business activity and transportation services, including the ferry service from Lahaina.

This grant if approved will allow the Lana'i Chamber of Commerce to expand both its capacity and the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event. Increasing the marketing of the Island to both residents and visitors to Maui County.

D. Economic Impact

The Chamber is the only membership based organization providing support to local businesses on Lāna'i. It has demonstrated that it can deliver benefit to its members, local businesses and the community.

The Fifth Friday Event continues to be popular having recorded 683 participants at the September 2016 Event. These participants spend \$\$ at local businesses and vendors. The number of vendor participants during 2016 increased from 23 to 38.

The late ferry has sold out or come close to selling out for the prior Events. For example, bookings for both the September and December Events had to be closed early due to the popularity of the late ferry and Lost on Lāna'i's Package.

Maui County should provide funding for this project in order to enable the Lana'i Chamber of Commerce to strengthen its organization, the community and promote the Island of Lāna'i while increasing economic activity for Lāna'i's small businesses. Funding will assist the Chamber in reaching its goal of creating programs and events under the umbrella of a sustainable Chamber organization that promotes business activity on Lāna'i while strengthening the local community.

G. Use of Community Resources

a. Volunteers

The Chamber and the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event utilize community volunteers in a multitude of ways. The Board of the Lana'i Chamber is currently an all-volunteer organization as is the Fifth Friday Committee, which is composed of both chamber members and non-chamber member volunteers, although a small stipend is paid to the Fifth Friday Coordinator. These volunteers represent a broad cross section of the community and range from business owners to high school students.

b. Other Community Groups

The Chamber hopes to maintain its collaboration with CDFL to support and promote the family friendly nature of the event. In addition to CDFL the Lanai Art Center and the Lanai Senior Center have been prior event participants. The event brings event visitors and locals alike into their facilities giving them the opportunity to communicate their mission, further strengthening our community through the involvement of our Kupuna and the sharing of the arts.

The Lana'i Chamber of Commerce is working with the Maui County Office of Economic Development's Maui Fridays Program. Fifth Friday Lāna'i became a partner/participant in Maui Fridays in 2015.

c. Describe how you will utilize labor, products, businesses and or Maui County vendors to carry out your program.

Local Lāna'i small businesses are the focus of the Chamber and the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event. The Chamber and the Fifth Friday Event could not exist without their support.

Where possible and practical the event will first utilize the goods, products and services of local Lāna'i businesses first. Then other businesses located in Maui County or within the state.

H. Economic Self-Sufficiency

The Chamber is working to make the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event self-sustaining by December of 2018.

The Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event will generate additional revenue by:

- The sale of Event Cards which provide access to specials, discounts and promotions by the participating businesses.
- The sale of Fifth Friday Lāna'i branded merchandise, including t-shirts, hoodies and hats.
- Generate additional revenue through sponsorships and add on activities such as a golf tournament or film showcase.
- Generate revenue through a silent auction as an adjunct to the event's free drawing.
- Generate additional revenue through higher participation fees.
- Increasing the value/popularity of event to Maui guests in order to support/justify increased "ticket" cost and reduce/eliminate need for subsidized late ferry.

The remaining components of this application (Websites and WIFI) will generate additional revenue for the Chamber via the sale of ads, listings or sponsorships and increase value to our members (Business Videos, Programs & Travel Stipend) thereby allowing for Chamber to grow membership and dues income.

I. Green Initiatives and Eco-Friendly Practices

Where possible the Fifth Friday Lāna'i Event will utilize or encourage the utilization of vans and small busses to transfer guests from the Manele small boat harbor and resorts to Dole Park. Event participants will be encouraged to utilize the recycle bins in Dole Park.

The Fifth Friday Committee is evaluating ways to reduce the use of a paper event cards including e mailing mobile device ready images, the option of combining a years access to event promotions with a special branded shirt or hat. The committee is also experimenting with the use of social media to reduce the number of flyers that are printed and distributed. Maui guest surveys are conducted via email and survey monkey.

Event Coordinator – This line item represents the budgeted cost for a Fifth Friday Event Coordinator.

Event Entertainment, Prizes & Promotion - This line item represents the cost of arranging local entertainment for the four events and any related promotional cost to make the Chamber, Lāna'i and the Fifth Friday Event better known. This line item also provides for the purchase or provision of free drawing prizes for the event. There will be in-kind contributions from local businesses.

Lodging & Travel/Support Chamber Directors & Event – This line item represents provides a travel stipend for Chamber Directors

Chamber Member & Community Developmental, Organizational & Educational Programs or Meetings – This line item provides seed funding for Chamber Member, Community Development, Organizational & Educational Programs or Meetings.

Public WIFI MESH Project – This line item provides for the purchase of the necessary hardware, its deployment and one year of maintenance & annual licensing of web content filtering software/services.

Volunteers & Misc. In-Kind – This line item is based on volunteers providing hours to the project valued at the current accepted rate of \$23.07/hr. and additional in kind goods and services.

Printing/Supplies – This line item is based on third party quotes received for printing the Event Cards for four events and the in-kind portion is value assigned to graphic design services and additional printing contributed.

Light Plants – This line item represents the cost of renting additional light towers for the event and the value of the light towers provided by Maui County and Maui Police Department. It is hoped that we can obtain a total of 3-4 light plants for each event. Value is estimated using a daily rental cost of \$130 per light plant.

T-Shirts & Merchandising – This line item represents cost to acquire branded/logoed items for resale.

Insurance – Cost of insurance.

MARKETING

Advertising/Banners/Materials/Design/Videos – This line item represents the cost of designing, producing and distributing re-useable banners, signs and promotional material to participating businesses. Also included in this line item is provision for the purchase of advertising to promote the event and funding for the filming and production of a series of videos promoting local businesses and highlighting Lāna'i.

Website Design, Maintenance & Hosting – This line item represents the cost designing, hosting and maintenance of Chamber websites. In addition to the expenditure it is anticipated that additional in-kind services will be contributed in support of the websites.

ADMINISTRATION

Fiscal Sponsor – This line item represents the 15% cost/fee associated with our fiscal sponsor administering the Grant.

INCOME

Event Cards – This line item represents the budgeted income from the sale of event cards at the four events.

Merchandise – This line item represents the budgeted income generated by the sale of t-shirts/branded merchandise.

Grant – County OED – The \$37,50.00 Grant.

In Kind and Volunteers – Sum-total of these categories.

Other - Cash, Grants – Includes other cash contributed by the Chamber, credits or carryover from cancellation of December 30, 2016 Fifth Friday will include any other grants received by the Chamber.

WHAT ABOUT VISITOR NUMBERS?

A Note from the Chair:

We all seem to be facing the challenge of attracting customers and increasing our business activity. The world has changed radically since the "Great Recession" of 08-09. Take a look at the chart below showing the number of arrivals to Lānaʻi by air:

Anecdotally I have heard many times that 06-07 were the last really good years for business and the visitor numbers reflect this. The year 2007 saw over 100,000 visitors to the island via air. The trough of the "Great Recession" saw this decline to only 61,000 annual visitors. While the number of annual visitor arrivals to Hawaiʻi and Maui County has since recovered and now exceed the pre-great recession peaks Lānaʻi only recorded 63,338 visitor arrivals via air in 2016 even with Manele being open for almost all of 2016.

Visitor statistics for January 2017 continue to reflect depressed numbers of visitors arrivals. January 2016 (Manele closed) recorded 4,264 arrivals and January 2017 (with Manele open) recorded only 4,629 visitors. An increase of only 8.6% and a far cry from the 8,542 visitors in January 2007.

Macro – Big Picture

Together, some of the Questions we need to answer are:

1. How can local businesses capture a greater % of visitors that are coming to the island?
2. How can additional visitor traffic be generated?
3. Who are the partners necessary to help make this happen?

Strategies the Chamber Board is working on:

1. Foster local businesses to develop new services, amenities and products that either pull guests from Manele or can be sold at Manele or online.
2. Create additional events and a PR/Marketing Campaign to promote visiting Lānaʻi from Maui – attract more of the 2.6 million annual visitors to Maui , i.e., borrow more for the day.

Micro – What can we do Immediately

#1 Coupons/Specials – Do you have any coupons or specials that you would like the Chamber to make available for guests and visitors? In addition to the Chamber's efforts at publicity we will share your coupons/specials/information with Rabaca's, Lost on Lānaʻi and the Cat Sanctuary.

FAQ's Community 100 acre Ag Park

1. 100 acre Community Ag Park? What about this Ag Park?

- A 100 acre Ag Park was "Condition 2" of for the Manele Golf Course Project and dates back to a 1991 LUC D&O, whereby the Company was required to set aside 100 acres for the establishment and operation of an agricultural park – by the State Department of Agriculture and County of Maui for Lāna'i residents. The Company complied insofar as a lease was entered into between the Company and the State Department of Agriculture. The lease is for 55 years and carries nominal fee of \$100 per year.
- CONDITION 2
- "Petitioner shall make available 100 acres of land, with an adequate supply of water, to the State Department of Agriculture and or the County of Maui, for their establishment and operation of an agricultural park for Lanai residents, at nominal rents for a 55-year term, at site(s) agreeable to the State Department of Agriculture and the County of Maui." Compliance: Petitioner has complied with this Condition 2. In that certain Indenture of Lease, dated July 15, 1994 and filed in the Land Court as Document No. 2165943, Dole leased to the BLNR 100 acres of real property for use as the Lanai Agricultural Park for purposes of discharging Petitioner's obligations under Condition 2. This lease was amended by that certain Amendment of Lease, dated August 19, 1994 and filed as Land Court Document No. 2199103. With respect to an "adequate water supply", the Lease states that the State "shall have the right to purchase from the public utility and to use up to, but not more than 0.20 MGD on the average annual basis." The Amendment of Lease states that, notwithstanding this quoted sentence of the Lease, "the parties further agree that additional water will be allocated to the agricultural park in the future, but that the need for such additional water will be the [State's] responsibility to justify and that any costs incurred for this additional water will be borne by the [State]."

2. Can I read a copy of the Lease with the State Department of Ag?

- Yes, a PDF Copy of the Lease may be found [here](#).

3. So why hasn't anything happened in the last 23 years?

- Short Story is that The State Department of Ag, by 1997 or so, felt that there was not sufficient community support for the project. Which was due largely to questions centered around the cost of agricultural water and how the development and ongoing costs would be bourn or shared between the state and the farmers. The Ag Resources & Technology available at the time also presented challenges to the project as did the logistics of delivering water and providing physical access to the property. The Lease was subsequently consigned to the file cabinet.

4. So has anything changed in the last 23 years?

- Yes, Achieving Food Sustainability and Supporting Locally Grown Food Resources have since become a central part of Maui County and State objectives and long range plans. New varieties, high value crops, value added products and new irrigation & technology have all emerged over the last 23 years. In addition additional Resources are now available, to support agricultural efforts and the creation of value added food products, within Maui County and the State. 5. So what else needs to change to make this happen – what would a first step be?

- The old adage "The squeaky wheel gets the grease" unfortunately holds true. Strong Community Support for a Community Agricultural Park needs to be demonstrated.

Dear Mayor Arakawa, Council Chair White, Council Member Hokama and Members of the Maui County Council,

An Analysis of the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Waiehu Golf Course is submitted for your review and further consideration.

Mayor Arakawa's Announced Shortfall of \$2 Million+ appears to have been gleaned by comparing the overall FY 2017 and FY 2016 Operations Budget for the Department of Parks and Recreation.

The 4-Year Comparison (FY 2014 – FY 2017) of the Operating Expenditures for the Parks and Recreation Department reflects a downward change of \$1,269,300, a downward change of 4.1%. The Parks and Recreation Department is providing exemplary service within budget and is financially sound and stable.

The 4-Year Comparison (FY 2014 – FY 2017) of Revenue from the Waiehu Golf Course reflects positive growth. \$2,362,200 in FY 2014, \$3,942,800 in FY 2015, \$3,860,400 in 2016 and \$4,228,500 in 2017 (Projection). This reflects a positive change of \$368,100, a positive change of 9.5%.

More detailed information is provided in the attached Analysis.

The Waiehu Golf Course is an integral, productive part of Maui County's economic engine.

2 Waiehu Golf Course Hole 5 • 234 Yards, Par 3

From the elevated tee box, golfers have a bird's-eye view of windsurfers and kite surfers plying the windswept ocean below. The mountain Haleakala rises in the distance, and the lush green valleys of the West Maui Mountains seem close enough to touch. This municipal course's par 3 provides plenty of time to enjoy the view, as groups tend to back up three and four deep as they wait to tee off.

When the wind blows, which is all the time, this is one of the toughest holes on Maui.

It takes a long tee shot to reach its small green. A towering sand dune looms large along the right side of the fairway and gives slicers fits. Trade winds quarter from behind and tend to sail errant balls into the dune's thick brush. This was the finishing hole back when Waiehu was only a nine-hole course. It makes you wonder how many matches were won and lost here in the treacherous wind.

Tall, spindly ironwood trees endure the wind and add rugged ambience to this long par 5, which borders more oceanfront than any other hole on Maui.

This is a classic links hole whose subtle nature makes it easy to dismiss at first glance, but thankfully, the guys who installed the fairway long ago left every little dune, dip, and roll along the length of the fairway.

Whether they were geniuses or just lazy, their work means golfers now may face any kind of side-hill lie, no matter how well they hit the center of the fairway.

The right side of the fairway is the place to be, but push it too far and you'll find the ocean. Strong trade winds occasionally bring balls back into play.



Fairway fantasy: piecing together an ideal round from Maui's championship courses

2 Waiehu Golf Course Hole 5 • 234 Yards, Par 3

From the elevated tee box, golfers have a bird's-eye view of windsurfers and kite surfers plying the windswept ocean below. The mountain Haleakala rises in the distance, and the lush green valleys of the West Maui Mountains seem close enough to touch. This municipal course's par 3 provides plenty of time to enjoy the view, as groups tend to back up three and four deep as they wait to tee off.

When the wind blows, which is all the time, this is one of the toughest holes on Maui.

It takes a long tee shot to reach its small green. A towering sand dune looms large along the right side of the fairway and gives slicers fits. Trade winds quarter from behind and tend to sail errant balls into the dune's thick brush. This was the finishing hole back when Waiehu was only a nine-hole course. It makes you wonder how many matches were won and lost here in the treacherous wind.

9 Waiehu Golf Course Hole 7 • 490 Yards, Par 5

Tall, spindly ironwood trees endure the wind and add rugged ambience to this long par 5, which borders more oceanfront than any other hole on Maui.

This is a classic links hole whose subtle nature makes it easy to dismiss at first glance, but thankfully, the guys who installed the fairway long ago left every little dune, dip, and roll along the length of the fairway.

Whether they were geniuses or just lazy, their work means golfers now may face any kind of side-hill lie, no matter how well they hit the center of the fairway.

The right side of the fairway is the place to be, but push it too far and you'll find the ocean. Strong trade winds occasionally bring balls back into play.

“In Scotland, where golf is believed to have originated in the 15th century, the first courses were developed on stretches of land known as links. Farmers deemed these coastal lands useless because of the sandy soil, so golf course designers began to make use of them. There are a number of true links courses still open for play in Scotland, including the course that has become known as the home of golf --St. Andrews. Ireland, Wales and England also have true links courses, but Scotland is believed to have the most.”

“A links course is along the sea, consists of sandy soil and has little vegetation other than tall sea grasses and gorse, a hearty low-growing evergreen plant. The natural terrain is used to develop the golf holes. Many of the bunkers were once natural windswept dunes. The layout of the holes is also part of a true links course, with the first nine going out to the farthest point from the clubhouse and the second nine bringing you back.”

“St. Andrews, Royal Troon, and Royal Dornach are considered three of Scotland's most famous and most traditional links courses. In Ireland, there are also traditional links, including Waterville, Ballybunion and Lahinch. The United States also has several famous links courses. One of them is the highly ranked Pebble Beach. Sinnecock Hills in New York and Bandon Dunes in Oregon are also traditional links.”

City purchase will preserve N. Shore area

The property covers a mile of shoreline, including the city's Kahuku Golf Course

The City and County of Honolulu announced Monday the purchase of 114 acres of the North Shore, saving a sizable chunk of oceanfront land that includes the Kahuku Golf Course from possible development.

The city closed the purchase with owner Continental Pacific LLC on Friday, using \$12.1 million from a voter-approved fund earmarked for land conservation.

“This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to keep the land open,” Mayor Kirk Caldwell said Monday during a news conference on the sandy beach fronting the property. “This is one of the most beautiful coastlines in the whole world.”

The property, bordering the 1,100-acre James Campbell National Wildlife Refuge, includes almost a mile of remote shoreline and wild coastal sand dunes. It also protects a surf break known as Seventh Hole.

The stretch of land is home to the only municipal golf course on the North Shore, a nine-hole course the city has operated under a lease agreement since 1937. Some 25,000 rounds of golf are played at the course every year.

Caldwell said the city intends to keep the golf course open and offer upgraded public access to the shoreline.

Councilman Ernie Martin, whose district includes the purchased land, said he’s been pushing for years to acquire the property.

“It’s a hidden gem,” he said.

Martin said the acquisition will not only preserve the scenic beauty of the area, but provide protection for migratory seabirds, turtles and seals.

“The environmental, recreational and economic benefits of acquiring this property are immeasurable,” he said.

Continental Pacific previously announced plans to close the golf course and develop luxury homes on the shoreline.

Negotiations for purchase of the land continued on and off for more than two years, according to Ray Soon, the mayor’s chief of staff, who led the negotiations.

“We had some reasonable disagreements,” he said. “It went back and forth at one point. We stopped negotiating. We thought it was dead. They came back to us, saying they really wanted to protect this area as well. We found common ground and we found a reasonable settlement.”

At one point the City Council set aside \$13.8 million for the purchase, Soon said, so ultimately it was a good deal, especially considering an additional 20-acre parcel was thrown in to better connect the property to the neighboring wildlife refuge.

“It was a fair price we paid,” Caldwell added. “If you look at it long term, absolutely it was a bargain. There is only so much shoreline property on this island. There’s only so much with an incredibly beautiful beach like this on the island. The values are just going to continue to go up.”

Lex Smith, an attorney who represents Florida-based Continental Pacific, said the company’s latest development plan included subdividing the golf course and creating six luxury beachfront homes.

Smith said the transaction was a reasonable deal.

“If Continental Pacific had followed through with their plan, it would have made more money (than the \$12.1 million),” he said.

Approved by Honolulu voters in 2006, the Clean Water and Natural Lands fund was a charter initiative that set aside a half-percent of real property tax revenue for land conservation purposes.

The City Council appoints nine members to the Clean Water and Natural Lands Commission, which evaluates properties targeted for acquisition.

Officials said this is the largest transaction since the fund was established in 2006.

“We have gone a long way working with the county to ensure these beautiful lands are preserved forever,” Caldwell said.

Guy Kaulukukui, director of the city’s Department of Enterprise Services, said it’s gratifying to know that the golf course will continue for the golfing public into the future.

He described Kahuku as the only truly links-style golf course in Hawaii.

“It’s our St. Andrews,” Kaulukukui said, referring to the classic golf course in Scotland. “It’s rustic and beautiful in its own way.”

With million-dollar views, the remote course offers the least expensive golfing on the island at \$1 per hole for residents and less than \$2 per hole for visitors (\$16). However, there are no golf carts, the restrooms are portable and the clubhouse is little more than a dilapidated shack.

“It’s more rusty than rustic,” Kaulukukui said.

He said now that the city has ownership, officials can look at ways to reinvest in the course and make some upgrades.

Caldwell said the course for now will be preserved for golf, but it could easily be transformed into a passive park in the future.

On the beach, the mayor pointed to the sand dunes and said they are part of an ecosystem that was here for thousands of years.

“There were dunes like this all along this side of the island,” he said. “They’ve been basically bulldozed and used for development, or they’ve eroded into the sea because of sea walls and roads that have been built. Here they will be protected.”

Martin said he would like to see the fund also be used to save a sizable portion of the undeveloped property across from Malaekahana Beach Park nearby.

We recommend the Hawaii State Employee Retirement System (ERS) acquire the Waiehu Municipal Golf Course. Maui County Mayor Alan has branded this real estate as a loser, an economic burden on the Maui County Budget. Mayor Arakawa's Proposed FY 2018 Budget has no line item for the Waiehu Golf Course.

As discussed below, ERS investment in prime real estate, including Kaanapali and the Kaanapali Golf Course, is a factor that has bolstered and ensured the retirement fund remain sound, self-sustaining and able to reduce accrued obligations and commitments.

Mayor Arakawa's pronouncement that the Waiehu Golf Course is a loser and an economic burden on the Maui County Budget appears to be a self-assessment. Specifically,

The ERS has more than 74,000 active and inactive vested members and over 45,000 retirees.

The pension fund plans to redevelop the lands surrounding its 100-acre, 36-hole Kaanapali Golf Course on Maui into a mixed-use development with homes, a hotel, restaurants, retail shops and entertainment, as first reported by Pacific Business News. The ERS has an investment portfolio valued at more than \$15 billion

The ERS has owned the Kaanapali Beach 305-acre property that includes the golf courses for about a decade. The ERS is redeveloping the lands surrounding its 100-acre, 36-hole Kaanapali Golf Course on Maui into a mixed-use development with homes, a hotel, restaurants, retail shops and entertainment.

The Hawaii State Employee Retirement System is underfunded and overcommitted by more than \$12 billion.

ANALYSIS

I. The ERS Real Estate Portfolio in Risk-based Classes, inclusive of Kaanapali properties and Kaanapali Golf Course, remains strong, stable and growth oriented.

II. The ERS Real Estate Portfolio in Risk-based Classes are self-sustaining.

III. The ERS Real Estate Portfolio in Risk-based Classes bankroll and grubstake the ERS by reducing the underfunded ERS and ERS over commitments accrued over the years in other areas, reported by Pacific Business News totaling to be more than \$12 billion.

IV. The ERS acquisition of the Waiehu Golf Course, in addition to I to III, extends the environmental corridor connecting with the 277 acre Waihe`e Coastal Dunes and Wetlands Preserve and is in keeping with the State of Hawaii's Coastal Zone Management Initiative.

The 250 acre Waihe`e Coastal Dunes and Wetlands Preserve (The Waihe`e Preserve) conserves and protects over 24 acres of coastal, spring-fed wetland, 103 acres of dune ecosystem, over one and a half miles of marine shoreline and more than 8 acres of riparian habitat for the recovery of native birds, insects and vegetation. In recent years, at least six endangered taxa, including the Hawaiian Stilt and Coot, two endangered plants and two endangered insects have been reported from the site.

The 250 acre Waihe`e Preserve is part of a 277 acre coastal dune and wetlands system that has been under imminent threat of development as a high-end destination golf resort. **The Maui Coastal Land Trust (MCLT) purchased the 277 acre Property through funding from the County of Maui,** US Fish and Wildlife Service Coastal Wetlands and Endangered Species grants and from private donations.

The Waihe`e Coastal Wetlands and Dunes Preserve Project will restore and permanently protect 250 acres of private property on the North shore of Maui. **This property extends along the coast from the WAIEHU GOLF COURSE to the mouth of Waihe`e Stream.** It encompasses 24 acres of wetland, 103 acres of buffering sand dunes, and approximately 8 acres of riparian habitat. Four streams flow through this property. [Emphasis Supplied]

Only three significant wetlands remain on the north shore today: Kanaha pond, Paukukalo, and Waihe`e. Kanaha Pond is managed as a wildlife sanctuary by the State of Hawaii, Department of Land and Natural Resources. This sanctuary is being restored with native vegetation and is successfully providing nesting habitat for the Hawaiian Stilt, Hawaiian Coot, and Hawaiian Duck.

THE WAIHE`E COASTAL DUNES & WETLANDS REFUGE TODAY

Active restoration is enhancing critical native wildlife habitat while preserving one of the most significant cultural sites in Hawai'i, once populated with two thriving Hawaiian villages, Kapoho and Kapokea.

Size: 277 acres Year Protected: 2004

Land Protection Strategy: Owned by the Land Trust

Conservation Values: Recreation, archaeological and cultural preservation, and habitat for native plants and animals

Land Features: Coastal wetlands, dunes, marine shoreline, near-shore reef systems and riparian habitat

The Land Trust took fee ownership of this very sensitive 277-acre site in 2004. Active restoration programs have enhanced critical native wildlife habitat, while preserving the area's rich archaeological and cultural resources. Once populated with two thriving ancient Hawaiian villages, an extensive inland fishpond and several heiau, the Waihe'e Refuge is among the most significant cultural sites in the state.

As a testament to the returning health of the ecosystem, eight different endangered species have taken up residence at the Refuge in recent years. With the wetlands primarily cleared and habitat-appropriate plants now thriving, the area is host to many native Hawaiian bird species, including ae'o (stilt) and 'alae ke'oke'o (coot). Native plants such as naupaka, 'ulei, 'akia, 'a'ali'i, pohinahina, and loulou are located on the Refuge. Additionally, 'uhaloa (used in Hawaiian medicine practice) and pili (grass used for the roof of traditional hale) are found here.

Quiet and pristine, the Waihe'e shoreline is a favorite retreat for endangered Hawaiian monk seals and nesting green sea turtles. Off the coast, the extensive reef is one of the longest and widest on Maui.

9 --- Waiehu Golf Course Hole 7 • 490 Yards, Par 5

Tall, spindly ironwood trees endure the wind and add rugged ambience to this long par 5, which borders more oceanfront than any other hole on Maui. This is a classic links hole whose subtle nature makes it easy to dismiss at first glance, but thankfully, the guys who installed the fairway long ago left every little dune, dip, and roll along the length of the fairway.

Whether they were geniuses or just lazy, their work means golfers now may face any kind of side-hill lie, no matter how well they hit the center of the fairway. [Emphasis --- Unequivocally Geniuses]

The right side of the fairway is the place to be, but push it too far and you'll find the ocean. Strong trade winds occasionally bring balls back into play.

2 --- Waiehu Golf Course Hole 5 • 234 Yards, Par 3

From the elevated tee box, golfers have a bird's-eye view of windsurfers and kite surfers plying the windswept ocean below. The mountain Haleakala rises in the distance, and the lush green valleys of the West Maui Mountains seem close enough to touch. This municipal course's par 3 provides plenty of time to enjoy the view, as groups tend to back up three and four deep as they wait to tee off.

When the wind blows, which is all the time, this is one of the toughest holes on Maui. It takes a long tee shot to reach its small green. A towering sand dune looms large along the right side of the fairway and gives slicers fits. Trade winds quarter from behind and tend to sail errant balls into the dune's thick brush. This was the finishing hole back when Waiehu was only a nine-hole course. It makes you wonder how many matches were won and lost here in the treacherous wind.

FUEL TAX FOR ON-ROAD BIODIESEL**

DESCRIPTION:

Mayor Alan M. Arakawa proposes an 18-cent per gallon fuel tax for on-road biodiesel to augment and supplement the Maui County Fiscal Year 2018 Budget.

In doing so, Mayor Arakawa seeks to override and supersede the Maui County Council and to terminate the fuel tax exemption for on-road biodiesel enacted and implemented for FY 2017.

POSITION:

I support extending the fuel tax exemption for on-road biodiesel and request that the Maui County Council include "biofuel" as provided in Hawaii Revised Statutes § 103D-1012 as discussed below.

COMMENTS:

The fuel tax proposed by Mayor Alan M. Arakawa diverges and is inapposite to US Congressional Legislation and Legislation enacted by the Hawaii State Legislature. Specifically

CONGRESS HAS USED TAX INCENTIVES TO STIMULATE DOMESTIC ENERGY PRODUCTION FOR MORE THAN 100 YEARS. Since being implemented in 2005, the biodiesel tax incentive has played a key role in stimulating growth in the U.S. biodiesel industry, helping it become the first EPA-designated Advanced Biofuel to reach commercial-scale production nationwide. By helping biodiesel compete on a more level playing field with petroleum, the \$1-per-gallon tax credit creates jobs, strengthens U.S. energy security, reduces harmful and costly emissions, diversifies the fuels market, and ultimately lowers costs to the consumer. There is a clear correlation between the tax incentive and increased American biodiesel production, which has grown from about 100 million gallons in 2005, when the tax incentive was first implemented, to almost 1.8 billion gallons in 2016. HRS § 103D-1012 (2015) Biofuel preference.

(a) **NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW TO THE CONTRARY, CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF DIESEL FUEL OR BOILER FUEL SHALL BE AWARDED TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE AND RESPONSIVE BIDDERS, WITH PREFERENCE GIVEN TO BIDS FOR BIOFUELS OR BLENDS OF BIOFUEL AND PETROLEUM FUEL.** [Emphasis Supplied]

(b) **WHEN PURCHASING FUEL FOR USE IN DIESEL ENGINES, THE PREFERENCE SHALL BE FIVE CENTS PER GALLON OF ONE HUNDRED PER CENT BIODIESEL.** For blends containing both biodiesel and petroleum-based diesel, the preference shall be applied only to the biodiesel portion of the blend. [Emphasis Supplied]

(c) **WHEN PURCHASING FUEL FOR USE IN BOILERS, THE PREFERENCE SHALL BE FIVE CENTS PER GALLON OF ONE HUNDRED PER CENT BIOFUEL.** For blends containing both biofuel and petroleum-based boiler fuel, the preference shall be applied only to the biofuel portion of the blend. [Emphasis Supplied]

(d) **AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "BIODIESEL" MEANS A VEGETABLE OIL-BASED FUEL THAT MEETS ASTM INTERNATIONAL STANDARD D6751, "Standard Specification for Biodiesel (B100) Fuel Blend Stock for Distillate Fuels", as amended.** [Emphasis Supplied]

(e) As used in this section, "**BIOFUEL**" MEANS FUEL FROM NON-PETROLEUM PLANT OR ANIMAL BASED SOURCES THAT CAN BE USED FOR THE GENERATION OF HEAT OR POWER. [L 2006, c 240, §4] [Emphasis Supplied]

Extending the preference to “biofuels” as provided in HRS § 103D-1012(c) and HRS § 103D-1012(e) for boilers addresses environmental concerns for continuing use of petroleum and coal.

To address economies of scale, production availability of “One Hundred Percent Biofuel” as defined in HRS § 103D-1012(c) and HRS § 103D-1012(e), and to provide a catalyst and stimulant for major commercial consumers, Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO), Maui Electric Company, LTD (MECO), Hawaiian Lighting Company (HELCO) and Kauai Island Utility Cooperative (KIUC) to reduce dependence on petroleum and coal recommended is broadening the 100% preference to include both biofuel (biodiesel) and petroleum-based boiler fuel (diesel). To assure availability to current consumers of 100% biodiesel and to provide clarity and specificity recommended is a definition of “biodiesel blend.” Specifically, “Biodiesel Blend - a blend of biodiesel fuel meeting ASTM D 6751 with petroleum-based diesel fuel, designated B20, a mixture composed of 20% of biodiesel with 80% of diesel.” While not a panacea and the ultimate solution for 100% clean, sustainable renewable energy, a B20 biodiesel blend is a step in the right direction and movement forward toward the ultimate goal established by Governor David Y. Aloha! I am writing on behalf of Lanai Community Health Center's (LCHC) Behavioral Health Program and wish to extend my gratitude and appreciation to the County of Maui, Mayor, and Committee for your continued support of LCHC's programs. LCHC has been the recipient of a Line Item Award for the past several years and these funds have been critical to supporting our continually expanding behavioral health program. This funding has also allowed our Lanai community to receive comprehensive health care, including behavioral health, regardless of whether or not they have insurance or the ability to pay.

I have been a part of the LCHC team for the past 3 years as a Post-Doctoral Psychology Fellow and Behavioral Health Specialist, currently under the supervision of Allison Seales, PhD. My hiring would not have been possible without the assistance of this grant! Through our integrative services, our medical and behavioral health providers are continuing to discover the behavioral health needs of our patients and are working together to develop collaborative treatment to promote the wellness of our patients, with the goal of decreasing the burden of chronic disease and improving quality of life. I have seen my caseload reach full capacity serving children, adolescents, adults, couples, and families. We have seen an overall surge in child and adolescent patients utilizing behavioral health services, especially through referrals from Child & Welfare Services and more recently, self-referrals and parental-referrals who prefer to have their child receive behavioral health services away from the school to protect their anonymity. We have also received referrals through Straub Clinic, who does not provide behavioral health services, and through Adult Mental Health Services, Lanai Community Hospital, Women Helping Women, and Aloha House. I expect the number of patients utilizing behavioral health services to increase to the expected growth of the island's population, the increasing visibility of services, and the rapid changes happening on the island. Re: County of Maui, DHHC—Behavioral Health Services

LCHC thanks the County of Maui, Mayor, and Council for continued support of the Lāna'i Community Health Center's (LCHC) programs. For the past several years, our Health Center has been the recipient of a Line Item Award. These funds have made it possible for our Health Center to provide services to all community members seeking health care, especially the un- and under-insured. We continue to utilize DHHC Grant funds to support our behavioral health program by providing support for our clinical psychologist's salary—leveraging funds we have received from insurance payments and other grants.

Our behavioral health program continues to be heavily utilized by community members — patients of LCHC and also those of Straub — as we provide the only such services on island. A number of our patients do not have coverage for behavioral health services — or the annual number of visits is severely limited. Also, a growing number of our Behavioral Health patients are asking to be seen in their home, to better protect their anonymity. While this is not as efficient as seeing patients in the office, it does increase the comfort level of the patient seeking assistance in handling their illness — LCHC is therefore reaching more patients who are in need of help. And with 70% of Lāna'i households being classified as low to middle income, and 40% of our population at or below 200% poverty level, County funding remains a critical component of our program.

Program growth has been steady—increasing in 2013 by 14.70%, 2014 by 16.97% and 2015 by 12.52%. Due to a staff shortage (a drop in 36% Psychologist FTE), we were



forced to see fewer patients in 2016 (34% drop in patients; 30% drop in encounters). We have managed a wait list with the assistance of University of Hawaii Psychiatry seeing those most in need through our tele-psychiatry program (supported by a federal grant). In addition to helping us with our staffing shortage, this additional service is of benefit to our patients and also our providers—as we become better educated about psychiatric medications and are able to obtain psychiatry consults quickly, without the patient having to leave our island.

Our request for FY2018 is for the County to continue to provide funding for our Behavioral Health Program — paying for direct services — a portion of our psychologist's compensation. In addition to providing psychological counseling, our psychologist also supports our medical and dental providers by providing integrated behavioral health services and playing an integral part in our wellness and lifestyle program development and management. We continue to seek additional funding streams that we can use to leverage the County's funding. In addition, we are also working with the insurers to provide improved reimbursement and coverage for our behavioral services. Also, to meet the continuous need for these services, we continue to recruit a second full-time, live on island licensed psychologist. This recruitment has proven to be difficult (we have been actively recruiting for almost 2 years) due to the remoteness of our island, limited and high cost housing, and lack of adequate supply of behavioral health providers.

These services are badly needed on our island—and with County support, these services will continue, in spite of all the challenges we face. We ask that you continue to support our program at its current level, \$82,610.

Testimony April 5, 2017

Aloha, I am Donna Clayton from Pukalani

I am speaking today regarding funding for the Mayor's office.

I thought it might be helpful to hear how one community person utilizes the services of the executive assistants.

In my work as one of the leaders for the West Maui Greenway planning I and the other members on the team have worked with John Buck, Rob Parsons (when he was an executive assistant) and Zeke Kalua in the early and ongoing planning stages for the greenway. We have requested assistance in many areas including setting up meetings with people who can guide us, providing meeting locations, helping us with a clean up project in the Ukumehame area, helping us find the best location for the greenway across county land sections, connecting us with community members who we are trying to include in the planning and more. We continue to be in constant contact with Zeke Kalua on the greenway. We have recently met with Don Couch, to discuss the next steps for the Greenway and realities of budget issues.

Also, we applied for and received a grant from the Hawaii Tourism Authority to help us with our upcoming Love the West Maui Greenway Day to be held April 22 at the Lahaina Civic Center's amphitheater with the goal of reaching out yet again to the community to include as many as possible in the process. This event will be evaluated by Teena Rasmussen's department as a requirement of the HTA funding and it is helpful to have Rob Parsons now in that department with knowledge of the long-term planning for the greenway and this Love the West Maui Greenway event.

In another area, as President of the Pukalani Community Association, I have several times reached out to Mike Molina to assist us with connecting with Verizon Wireless people who are planning a wireless location in Pukalani. Mike has assisted me in providing connections to the people I needed to reach and in setting up a meeting with the Mayor, Will Spence,

new council member Yuki Lei Sugimura, and others to discuss our concerns with Verizon. Mike continues to be responsive as we work through this community issue.

I'm not sure how many others in the community are in constant contact with the executive assistants but from my point of view, the people I have worked with have helped me a lot in moving various community issues forward in a positive way. The Mayor cannot be everywhere to hear and address all concerns. Because Maui County is a growing community, it is important for him to have adequate staff to represent him and respond to an ever increasing amount of concerns in a timely manner.

Priorities for 2018 Maui County Budget

Sidewalks: We are grateful for the sidewalk from King Kekaulike High School down upper Old Haleakala Hwy. Additional sidewalks are needed in the following locations:

1. Continuation for the sidewalk along Old Haleakala Hwy. from Loha St. to Pukalani St.
2. For the safety of those trying to walk from the lower Old Haleakala Hwy. to the shopping center, a continuation of the existing sidewalk on the lower portion of Old Haleakala Hwy. from the planned new development to the shopping center is needed. The road is narrow, winding and dark at night and is currently a dangerous situation which will get a lot more dangerous with the addition of 170 new single family units planned for that area.
3. We request a continuation of sidewalks from Pukalani Terrace Shopping Center along Pukalani St. to the Liholani St. stop sign near the golf course entrance.

Feral Chickens/Roosters: We request the following to help with the increasing problem of feral chickens/roosters:

1. Provide a reasonable budget to research and act upon the problem of feral chickens.
2. Provide funding for the creation of a chicken hotline for complaints and information.
3. Create a noise control policy on Maui. Many mainland counties have successfully put noise ordinances into place, eliminating the suffering of many caused by the few who feed or raise roosters in residential areas.

Hannibal Tavares Community Center/Pukalani Park: We received word that the two (2) picnic benches (tables and chairs) purchased by the Pukalani Community Association for the park will be installed at the Pukalani Park in the location provided to the Parks Dept. shortly. We would appreciate the following:

1. Timing light for tennis courts. Lights are often left on when no one is there.
2. We would like to work with the Parks and Recreation Dept. to add shade trees in Pukalani Park.

Skatepark:

We strongly support the creation of a free, public, concrete skatepark in the Pukalani Park to provide a positive athletic opportunity to a growing population of upcountry youth and adult skateboarders.

Invasive Species Control: We are not yet experiencing complaints about Coqui frogs but would certainly not welcome them to Pukalani. The news that little fire ant control is difficult and requires diligence by both the community and inspectors was heard loud and clear. We request funding for a dog handler and a sniffer dog to locate little fire ants as soon as possible as it seems like state-wide the ants are getting ahead of us. The latest alert on rat lungworm disease that is no longer eradicable on Maui according to Dr. Pang shows invasive species control needs to be a top priority – including prevention, control and public education.

Upcountry Water List: Our group is impatient with the slow progress to provide water to those on the list. New units in Pukalani increase this concern and some wondered if there is a way to release water to the next person on the water list for every so many new units allowed. Any way to move through this list faster would be appreciated.





1. Reduce trash pick up to once a week. One can \$24/mon, two cans at \$30/mon. On my street about half the people only put out one can a week. I put out two, buy only because truck has to turn around at end of the street at my house. Saves wear and tear on equipment and reduces staff requirements while keeping rates stable for most people.
2. Enforce qualification for ag water rates and property taxes by requiring annual certification via GET filings that ag production is actually occurring. In my subdivision I would guess at least of third of the people get ag water and property tax rates for doing absolutely nothing ag. Simply stealing money from county because no one requires proof of ag activity.

Greetings Budget Committee:

I am

sending this e.mail due to the insufficient space afforded on your post card reply.

My suggestions are as follows. Before the Council decides to increase the budget, was a study or investigation made to try and 'trim the fat' and elimination of costs by offering efficient serves to the people of Maui County? 1. 'what goes around, comes around'. When two managers of different departments in our county government were accused and confirmed of their illegal activities in the past while employed by the County, why were they kept on the county payroll until they qualified for their county pension benefits. This only added more costs to the County in the long run. (County Parks Director/County Garage kitchen). I'm sure the Mayor was involved in this. 2. The proposal by the Mayor to increase garbage collection rates by \$30.00 per month is going to hit retirees big time, with their fixed incomes. Rumor has it that the County collection department has a scheme going on where employees, on a 3 day week-end or holiday on a Friday or Monday, would take sick leave to extend their length of days-off. This causes the use of ever-time to cover the lack of personnel. Again, rumor has it, that this is ongoing, involving an employee and his 2 sons. What is Human Resources doing about this? Is there a malfunction between a union and management? It is our taxpayer's money involved here. 3. Our County government seems to think that by passing new laws is the way to correct problems. How about enforcing present laws before we pass new ones. Example: a) To resolve the affordable housing shortage the 'ohana' code now permits an ohana can be put on a lot of lesser size than was previous. This creates more stress to neighbors. Presently there are 2 story homes in Kahului whose neighbors don't get direct sunlight until the sun is overhead. This is unacceptable. There are house lots in Kahului where by multi-families reside with a cottage and adjoining units either in the main house and /or multiple breeze -way connections. This adds stress to our infrastructure. So much for single-family codes.

4. There is a building at the corner of Kahiki and Wakea Streets in Kahului where by (supposedly) a contractor from Honolulu bought the house, demolished it, then built a rental complex to house his employees for jobs on Maui. Is this short-term housing? Are the construction workers from Maui not good enough?

5. There are multiple multi-family homes in in Kahului and yet I understand that Kahului building codes restricts house lots to be one main home and an ohana. Is this code being enforced? Why not create a 'code enforcing brigade' of a dozen employees who would inspect new construction maybe 6 to 12 months after the final County inspection 'for occupancy', to confirm compliance of the county codes. The fines and fees collected would more than cover the costs of maintaining this brigade. This same brigade could be incorporated with the 'short term rental' brigade that the county already has. On this same topic, has an investigation been made to verify that home-owners who are receiving 'home-owners' tax credits are actually residing in their homes? Again, another chore for this brigade.

In conclusion: I believe that the County should be 'akamai' with their spending, investigate waste, correct this waste if found, become more efficient for the benefit of County residents.

The Kula Community Association BUDGET PRIORITIES for Fiscal Year 2018 are:

1. **Water Supply** - The Kula Community Association Board continues to prioritize the creation of a system that provides dependable, quality water for all our residents and that provides water meters for the Upcountry Water Meter List. We encourage the Council to insure that funding is available for water storage alternatives and to request cost estimates for various sized reservoirs in the up-country area. KCA thanks the Administration for bringing the water billing system back to Maui.

2. **Children's Safety** - The Council should assure that actions are taken to construct the connector sidewalk to the existing Lower Kula sidewalk, in the vicinity of Haleakala Waldorf School. There is no safe way for the 264 children and their parents to walk between the school on Lower Kula Road and the Kula Gym. The County is encouraged to cooperate with the State to complete sidewalks that connect Kula Elementary School to residential areas within one mile of the school. The high volume of traffic on Kula Highway indicates the need for a crosswalk with flashing lights from Rice Park to Kula Country Farms. Speed limits need to be enforced.

3. **Invasive Species Control** – KCA strongly supports County efforts to control, reduce and eradicate invasive species, especially the Little Fire Ant, glycine, coqui frogs and Axis Deer. Please include very much needed, increased funding for Maui Invasive Species Control (MISC) and other programs. (Glycine weed needs to be emphasized as a destroyer of Jacaranda trees)

4. **County Support for Agriculture** - We urge the Council to provide funding to enable the County to ensure consistency among County departments in how agriculture is viewed and supported. None of the departments which farmers and ranchers deal with most, e.g., Water, Planning, and Real Property Tax, have experienced, educated agriculture inspectors.
Farmers and ranchers are faced with appealing decisions that have been made incorrectly regarding water rates, building permits, and/or property taxes. We need either funding for new inspectors or funding to train existing inspectors.
Increased support + training + land is needed to help new farmers get back onto the land.

5. **Road improvements and maintenance** - We would like to see the Council insist the County Administration establish a priority list of roads on the county's web-site that need to be repaved within each district of the County, and then budget and build the highest priority road improvements.

6. **The Kula Bus – Route Extension** - The Kula community appreciates the recent extension of the Kula Bus Route to serve the Waiohuli Hawaiian Homelands and to help commuters, students and Kula Hospital workers. Mahalo for addressing the particular needs of this area and for revising the bus schedule to reflect our community's needs.

7. **Replacement of Playground Equipment and Planting Trees** - We request the vandalized toddler playground equipment be replaced and that shade trees be planted for the picnic areas and for spectators on both the upper and lower fields.

8. **Bike Safety** – We request that the Council insure the funding of bicycle pullouts along Crater Road and Haleakala Highway towards Makawao as detailed in the 2010 Kimura Study, perhaps utilizing State-collected TAT funds or fee assessments on the tour-bike companies per bike rental.

9. **Kula Community Center** - This is a facility on leased land for which the County has already spent million\$. Please finalize the actual allocation of funds to acquire the land under the Kula Community Center and tennis courts this year. The cost will only rise as the land's lease-term comes to an end.

10. **Kula Recycling** – We request that:
 - a) a recycling site be established in the Kula area;
 - b) a location for the disposal of appliances, TVs, etc. be located at the central landfill or similar central location to keep this kind of trash off our road-sides; and
 - c) establish an organic composting capability/facility for purely non-toxic materials, e.g., green-waste, restaurant waste, etc.

Hi,

I'm responding to your flyer requesting feedback regarding the Mayor's proposed budget.

I'm disappointed that while the flyer included the 2018 high level budget breakdown and noted the overall 9.2% year over year increase, it did not include the year over year breakdown by functional area. That makes it very difficult for folks to provide constructive feedback about whether the 9.2% increase is warranted and whether the amount allocated to areas is sufficient. The "Eight Year County Fund Expenditures by Functional Area" (Figure 1-7) in the Mayors budget package is a tool that provides this information. That table, or something similar, should have been included in the flyer.

Looking at the 8 year trend, I see that most of the Mayor's 2018 budget increase is due to capital improvements. Indeed, his proposed operating budget is only a 3% year over year increase. His proposed budget for capital improvement projects is a 38% increase.

Reviewing the projects on the capital spending list, I see that several of them are to bring wastewater and other facilities into compliance. Without detailed review (which I assume you'll do) it is difficult to determine which projects are mandatory, and how best to prioritize the deferred maintenance items. I can tell you from personal experience that some of our parks facilities, for example the locker rooms at the Lahaina Aquatic Center and the bathrooms at Waiehu, are run down and need to be refreshed.

The Mayor's proposed operational budget for "Culture and Recreation" decreases year over year by \$2.2M (-6%). I assume the reduction is due to Waiehu closure, which I'm very much against. The golf course is a tremendous recreational asset, especially for our seniors who have fewer recreational options. If anything, I'd propose more focus on this spending area to improve the cleanliness and upkeep of our parks, rec centers, pools and the golf course.

One mistake in the Mayor's budget is his proposal to institute landfill fees for residents. I've lived in cities with dump fees on the mainland. They promote dumping on the side of the road. Three dollars isn't much to most of us but I'm sure any fee will result in trash dumped where it shouldn't be. Besides, by the time you pay for the fee collection infrastructure to collect \$3 fees and you pick up the trash on the roadways, I doubt you'll generate much revenue. And meanwhile, you'll impact the quality of life for residents and tourist impressions driving by the dumped trash, mattresses and sofas. This is one area where you want to encourage citizens to do the right thing. Keeping it free and easy does that. While on this subject, over the past couple years the County reduced our options for disposing hazardous waste. The same thing applies here. I am the Executive Director of the Coalition for Drug Free Lana'i (CDFL), which is the only prevention based agency on Lana'i that serves the general community. Thank you for your support you have provided to the Coalition and your partnership these past years and greatly appreciate the line item allocation of \$42,012. The County of Maui funding was utilized twenty fold as matching funds by leveraging the monies with other funders, partners, and specifically with our Federal Funding through the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Office of the President and the State of Hawaii, Drug and Alcohol Abuse Division with a STOP ACT grant.

This funding would not be possible without the commitment of the County of Maui. Federal mandate requires our Drug Free Coalition to have a partnership with our local government providing matching funds in order to receive funds through SAMHSA and other Federal agencies.

This year your commitment to our efforts continues to make a tremendous difference in our community such as the Annual Student Drug and Alcohol Use Survey, prevention education in partnership with Lanai High & Elementary School such as the Botvin Lifeskills Evidence Based curriculum. Health Fairs for the community and the Four Seasons Resorts employees, training opportunities for partners, strategic planning and environmental studies which provide hard data specific to the island of Lana'i. The collected data is a much needed resource for all organizations on Lana'i needing data specific to our island.

Moving forward the CDFL has been encouraged by our federal partners, as a veteran Coalition to assist our neighbor communities who are interested on Maui and Molokai islands in mobilizing and starting a movement in developing coalitions in communities within our county. This will assist with collaboration and partnership of prevention efforts amongst the Tri Isles. This will also allow the Lana'i community to look at a new strategy for another 10 year prevention grant by working with others in the prevention field and expanding our reach through the County of Maui.

As well as continued emphasis on environmental strategies relating to tobacco, drug use, underage drinking and alcohol abuse at our only public beach park and public facilities within our community and continued support of compliance checks at all licensed alcohol sale points.

This coming year in June 2018 the CDFL has applied once again for the service for the US Armed Forces, Innovative Readiness Training Unit (IRT). Previously this military mission was held in the County of Maui and Hawaii in June 2012 providing medical, dental, veterinary, engineering, carpentry, entomologist to mention a few of the free services provided during the Operation Tropic Care Maui

County over a seven day period. We ask for your support of this disaster training opportunity for our Armed Forces as well as the benefit to our Maui County citizens.

We ask for your continued support of our partners the Keiki O Lana'i Preschool, Maui Economic Opportunity, Lanai Kaunoa Senior Center and Women Helping Women.

The Vision of the Kula Community Association is to preserve open space, support agriculture, maintain a rural residential atmosphere, and to work together as a community.

I am here to support this vision as it relates to agriculture and the supply of water. Our Board will be testifying on specific concerns our Association has; however, I would like to address two strategic issues that I believe you as the Budget Committee of the Council for the County of Maui should consider.

First is the support of Agriculture. If tax rates are to be raised, please consider not raising agriculture rates so as to our agriculture providers are spared an added expense. I would also urged you to consider increasing the Ag Park to enable some farmers the ability to obtain land to produce crops they may not be able to do elsewhere.

Second is the provision of an adequate water supply for Upcountry Maui including Kula. Consider the capital expense necessary to provide adequate water storage facilities for use during dry periods. Our Water Supply Department may need additional funding to enable storage capacity to be built in a timely manner. The longer we wait the more difficult it will become.

Aside from having you give some hard thought on how to address these strategic issues, I would also like to discuss two specific items that our Board included in their testimony:

1) Play equipment for toddlers in the Kula Park is one that I have been attempting to have replaced every since the former equipment was vandalized. We have a community of older individuals that care for young children while their parents are working and this equipment would provide a welcome activity for those children (and it will not cost much).


2) Road maintenance is needed on many roads; however, two not included in this year's budget are the upper portion of Lower Kimo Road and the top half of Pulehuiki. I invite you to take your new car and drive up or down either road and wonder when you would need new shocks if you had to drive them every day. Aloha and good morning, Chair and Councilmembers. Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony about the Mayor's proposed 18-cent per gallon tax on Biodiesel in the County's 2018 Budget.

My name is Joy Galatro and I'm a resident of Kihei. Maui was my childhood home. As a little girl at Makawao Elementary School, some of my most cherished memories involved Maui's natural environment: my first whale watch as 4th grader, countless weekends on my boogie board at the beach, and rare road trips to lush Hana. Growing up on Maui gave me a lifelong love and respect for nature and our fragile environment.

After living on the mainland for the last 33 years, I felt the call to come back home to Maui. I wanted to do something to give back to this culture and this land that had given me such a strong foundation as a child. When I moved here and learned that Hawaii had become the first state in the nation to mandate 100% renewable energy, it gave me a tremendous sense of pride and optimism.

And then I began working for Pacific Biodiesel. This pioneering company started on Maui two decades ago when one man (our founder Bob King) saw waste cooking oil being dumped into our landfill and said, there must be better way. He figured out a way to make biodiesel from those waste oils, eliminating this environmental hazard and creating the first retail biodiesel pump in the USA. Today we have more than 80 employees statewide (18 here in Maui County). We are a local company, creating local jobs, and making the nation's highest quality biodiesel, which is sold entirely in Hawaii, making a positive impact on our local economies.

I just purchased my first diesel automobile that I will proudly fuel with 100% biodiesel. I'm excited to walk the talk of sustainability by driving my car on renewable fuel. So you can imagine my shock when I learned about the Mayor's plan to raise the tax on biodiesel from 0 to 18 cents per gallon. **In a state committed to renewables, this tax sends the wrong message - it's taxing the solution (renewable fuels) not the problem (fossil fuels).** In fact, there is NO proposed increase to the on-road tax for Gasoline or Petroleum Diesel in the Mayor's 2018 Budget.

That's at least \$268,000 we saved local restaurants in 2016 alone and over \$1.5 million in the past 7 years. We've experienced the fluctuating impact of enactment and exemption of Maui's biodiesel fuel tax over the past few years: since the tax was 100% exempted in 2016, we have added 3 new jobs in Maui County. In contrast, when the 9-cent per gallon tax was enacted in 2015, we saw our Maui County fuel sales drop by 12%. This tax will cause a negative impact on our business; keeping the tax exemption will have a positive impact on our business. We know this, because we've already experienced it.

In summary, Pacific Biodiesel is proud to be headquartered in Maui County. We love our community and we are excited to begin many exciting new projects here because we're able to invest back into our company thanks to support for renewables. Our Maui sunflower biofuel crop – the largest of its kind in the state – is already seeing its first sunflowers begin to bloom. These eye-catching symbols of sustainability are making Maui County proud and hopeful again!

Thank you Chair and Council members, my name is Kim Sloan and by way of disclosure, I work for Pacific Biodiesel. However, I'm giving this testimony as a private individual with strong convictions about the importance of a clean energy future.

I'm here to urge you to dismiss the 18-cent per gallon fuel tax for on-road biodiesel. Biodiesel fuel is a clean, sustainable renewable energy resource that is produced right here in the state of Hawaii. Pacific Biodiesel is an innovative company that established the first biodiesel pump in the whole of the United States right here on Maui, was founded on Maui and employs 18 people on Maui and 80 state wide. This proposed punitive tax seems specifically designed to penalize a Maui company invested in providing clean energy. In front of recent Maui Energy Conferences, the mayor himself specifically supported home grown fuels as one way of mitigating the high cost of importing fossil fuels and specifically advocated biofuels because "the economic benefit to our community can be huge". (This quote can be found online at the Maui Energy Conference website - <https://vimeo.com/162009833>. The Mayor starts speaking at 18:22 and starts talking about fuel at 21:30.)

The proposed tax hike simply makes renewable biofuel more expensive and our commercial customers have told us that they will either pass on their increased costs -- hundreds of thousands of dollars -- to Maui residents, or revert to using diesel fossil fuel. I have driven on biodiesel for the last five years as I'm one of the many believers on this island of a renewable energy future and will never again use fossil fuel as a matter of principle. This increase penalizes our customers who are doing the right thing by choosing to drive on renewables. In a state committed to 100% renewable energy, this proposed tax sends the wrong message -- it's taxing the solution (renewable fuels) not the problem (fossil fuels).

As a postscript, I'd like to point out that biofuels are at least as strategically important as the welcome trend towards electric vehicles. The county has invested in electric vehicles and infrastructure that plug into the grid. Our grid in Maui County is still run on 65% fossil fuel. So, until our grid is 100% renewable, every electric car plugged into our grid is still powered to some extent with fossil fuel. Unfortunately, Pacific Biodiesel has not gotten the same recognition from the county of Maui. It's a bit embarrassing that our county has not even tried to use biodiesel in any of their diesel fleets where they would have to make no modification and they would be supporting a local company and not relying on imported fossil fuel.

Finally, I know I am not alone in my belief that the proposed tax on biodiesel is politically and personally motivated as it makes no environmental or ecological sense.

Dear Maui County Council,

As a retired employee of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service who served as the plant recovery coordinator for 22 years, I would like to take this opportunity to emphasize the importance of continued Maui County support for the Maui Nui Botanical Gardens (Garden). The Garden plays a vital role in the conservation of rare and endangered plant species for Maui County through public education, off-site propagation of these species, and reintroduction of these species back into native habitat.

The Garden is a fundamental partner in Hawaii's Plant Extinction Prevention Program (PEPP), which protects rare Hawaiian plants with fewer than 50 individuals remaining in the wild. The Garden plays an important role in PEPP, an informal partnership that formed a Maui Nui portion of the program in 2006. We would not have been able to make the Maui Nui PEPP happen without the Garden's coordination of meetings with the other members to compile data on rare Maui Nui species. The Garden also assists the program through the propagation of those PEP species found at lower elevations similar to that of the Garden. Most importantly, the Garden has played a lead role in the propagation of perhaps the rarest Hawaiian plant, kanaloa (*Kanaloa kahoolaweensis*), currently known from only one very unhealthy plant on Kahoolawe. The Garden is working with several partners to find a successful way to propagate this plant, using creative solutions for this species that is very difficult to propagate, to save this species from extinction. This and other plants grown at the Garden will be used for long-term genetic storage as well as to provide material for long-term recovery through reintroduction into protected habitats.

The Garden's ongoing support from the Maui County Council is critical to its ability to continue assisting in this Plant Extinction Prevention program. We hope you will consider this when you make your budget decisions.



RE: Complaint Statement

I, Marilyn McAteer, hereby provide the following concise statement of facts constituting unethical conduct by Council Member Donald Couch, who has issued dishonest and apparently fraudulent public disclosures and statements during open public Council hearings, as follows;

On March 18, 2016, Council Member Donald Couch responded to my public testimony relating to County officials and attorneys entering into unaccounted for agreements with private developers that end up making the taxpayers and citizens of Maui County pay for their subdivision infrastructure financial obligations.

Council Member Donald Couch informed the public and fellow members of the Maui County Council that ***“we did launch an investigation, and it was done in public here in 2013.”*** Mr. Couch also stated ***“We do, we do have the minutes, and you are able to watch it. But this has been vetted and investigated, and so we are where we are because we have gone through a complete investigation”.***

Written requests were made to Council Member Couch to provide proof of the so-called ***“complete investigation”*** he represented took place ***“in public”***. None of my requests were ever responded to by Council Member Couch. I made requests for documentation, findings, and conclusions of the alleged public Maui County Council investigation into the misuse of public funds by the County Administration.

As shown on my attached affidavit, no evidence of any public investigation has been produced by Council Member Couch or the Department of The Corporation Counsel. While the County Council certainly has the power to conduct an investigation upon the operation of any department or function of the County, pursuant to Section 3.6.3. of the Maui County Charter, it is now perfectly clear that no such investigation by the Maui County Council ever took place.

Council Member Donald Couch refused to respond to requests for substantiation of his public investigation statements. His silence, along with the fact that there apparently was no Council public investigation, means that he has breached his official duty and violated the trust and integrity of government under Article 10, Section 10.1, 10-4b., and 10-4.c. of the Maui County Charter by making false and misleading statements and disclosures to the public and fellow elected officials.

Further investigation may find violations of Sunshine Laws and the Hawaii Penal Code, as reasonable minds would assume that meetings have taken place behind closed doors to discuss the uncollected and unaccounted for developer agreements, and perhaps government records have been tampered with or are being concealed from the public. The penalties for such behavior, unbecoming an elected public official are set forth in Section 10-5 and may include fines or removal from office or impeachment proceedings pursuant to Article 13, Section 13-13.

From my view as a citizen and resident of Maui County, it appears that Councilmember Couch's intent is to shield and to protect the financial interests of private developers in his district of Kihei and county-wide, where the records indicate developer's financial interests have been served by public officials for many years.

Affidavit of Marilyn McAteer

I, Marilyn McAteer, state as follows;

1. I am citizen of the United States of America, a resident of Lahaina, County of Maui, State of Hawai'i, and I am over 21 years of age.
2. In the fall of 2014, I attended a public hearing in Lahaina piloted by the State of Hawaii Department of Transportation which was about the State funding of roadway improvement projects within the County of Maui.
3. At the hearing there was a rather large group of citizens concerned with the proposed roadway project Phase IV of Lower Honoapiilani Road. The proposed roadway project was also previously listed as being funded in the County of Maui Budget. I currently live on Phase IV of Lower Honoapiilani Road.
4. As we learned, the meeting was not about design, safety, or the timing of the construction of Phase IV, but solely addressing the proposed State share of funding. I learned this Phase IV project was first proposed and funded by the County of Maui in the late 90's, and the residents of Lower Road and West Maui were initially noticed by the County Directors that construction of the roadway project would commence in 2002.
5. From what I have been told by my neighbors, the County of Maui has never received all of the land frontage rights to build this roadway project and there are ongoing disagreements on compensation and impacts on the Lower Road property owner's homes and land.



6. I have also attended meetings with a local citizen group known as “Slower Road”. The motivation of the group is work with the County of Maui to address citizens’ concerns for both safety and impacts of the proposed Phase IV roadway project.

7. My research finds that the County of Maui has spent \$1.2 million dollars to date on this Phase IV roadway project, and just this year the project was suddenly erased from the County’s list of proposed roadway capital improvement projects.

8. On March 28, 2016, I sent the attached letter to my Council Member Elle Cochran, the Chair of Infrastructure Management, to obtain an explanation of why this project has been eliminated. Council Member Cochran never responded to my written request. (#1)

9. First, I don’t understand why the County of Maui would invest and waste such large sums of taxpayer’s money, and waste citizens’ valuable time on a public hearing about a roadway project without first acquiring the necessary land frontage rights.

10. Second, I state for the record this roadway in front of my home is unsafe and I have serious concerns for the pedestrians and bicyclists that are put in harm’s way with the cars and buses that race along the narrow and bumpy pavement.

11. After the public meeting was concluded, I sat at a table where a discussion was taking place between West Maui resident Christopher Salem and Senator Roz Baker.

12. Mr. Salem presented to Senator Baker a notebook filled with aerial maps of Maui County with markings of countless residential subdivisions with incomplete roadway frontage improvements. As I learned, the subdivisions were bound by development agreements executed by County Administration. It was represented that these agreements required repayment and sharing of the cost of the roadway infrastructure improvements, once the County

initiated a capital improvement project such as Phase IV of Lower Road. I was told that the County agreements are commonly known as developer infrastructure financial “deferral” agreements.

13. I also learned there appears to be thousands of developer “deferral” agreements that have never been accounted for or collected upon by the County of Maui. We, the taxpayers have been deceived by County officials. We have been paying for private developer’s infrastructure improvements for decades. If this is correct, then an investigation would conclude the developers contribute nothing as the subdivision agreements require.

14. When questioned on how she would resolve this issue, Senator Baker stated the County has clearly has been grossly negligent and considering how long the County has ignored collecting upon the agreements, perhaps they should just be erased, or perhaps a citizen should hire an attorney.

15. Despite the fact these private developer infrastructure obligations are being paid with County, State and Federal taxpayer funds, Senator Baker offered no assistance to Mr. Salem to hold our elected officials accountable for their unethical conduct.

16. On March 18, 2016, I testified before the Maui County Council of the Whole. I brought up these agreements with land developers that deceptively handover their infrastructure financial obligations to us, the taxpayers. I raised the above serious violations of public trust, the County Code, and the County Charter. I reminded the County Council that our own county government attorneys from the Department of The Corporation Counsel, are employed to serve the public interest and yet authored the “deferral” agreements to private developers. As we now know, these agreements were never collected upon. including unlawful overlapping “deferral” agreements. (#2)

17. At the conclusion of my testimony, Council member Don Couch interrupted and informed the public and fellow members of the Maui County Council that “*we did launch an investigation, and it was done in public here in 2013.*” Mr. Couch also stated “*We do, we do have the minutes, and you are able to watch it. But this has been vetted and investigated, and so we are where we are because we have gone through a complete investigation*”. A copy of the minutes to the March 18, 2016 Council meeting is attached. (#3)

18. On March 28, 2016 I sent a letter to Council Member Couch requesting a copy of the complete public investigation that Member Couch stated was performed in 2013.(#4)

19. **I received no response from Council Member Couch.**

20. A copy of my letter was also sent on March 28, 2016 to Council Member Mike White, the Chair of the Maui County Council. A copy is attached. (#5)

21. **I received no response from Council Member White.**

22. On April 6, 2016 I testified before the Committee of the Whole Budget hearing at the West Maui Civic Center.

23. On April 9, 2016 I sent a follow up letter to Council member Don Couch with a copy sent to Chair White, Mayor Arakawa, the County Clerk, and the State of Hawaii Office of Information Practices, once again requesting proof and documentation of the alleged complete Maui County Council “investigation”. (#6)

24. With the April 9, 2016 letter I provided a copy of letter from Public Works Director David Goode, transmitted and signed by Mayor Arakawa that describes monies owed to the County of Maui through the developer agreements along Phase IV of South Kihei Road. (#7)

25. Phase IV of South Kihei Road is a Capital Improvement Project currently in the approved County of Maui budget. The project is located in Council member Couch’s

district.

26. On May 19, 2016 I received a copy of a letter from the State of Hawaii Office of Information Practices sent to Council Member Couch informing him to provide a response or copies of the announced public Maui County Council investigation. (#8)

27. On May 25, 2016 I requested copies of the alleged Council minutes and investigation from Council Services of the Maui County Council. (#9)

28. On May 26, 2016 I received a letter from Corporation Counsel Attorney Brian Bilberry stating "***there are not documents in the possession of the agencies and officials from whom you are seeking documents relating to the investigation of Christopher Salem's claims.***" (#10)

29. Corporation Counsel Attorney Bilberry's attempts to tie my citizen request for public documents to a legal case in which I have no involvement and am not a party to, is itself, unethical. Further, attorney Bilberry then requested a payment of \$1,761.00 for copies of documents which have no relationship to my request for proof of a complete Maui County Council investigation, including the minutes of a hearing which Council Member Couch represented took place. I believe that Mr. Bilberry's acts are rude, deceptive, and unethical.

30. On June 11, 2016, I sent a follow up letter to the State of Hawaii Office of Information Practices informing them of attorney Bilberry's attempt to bill me over \$1,700.00 for documents which have nothing to do with my request for minutes, findings, and conclusions of the investigation Mr. Couch publicly disclosed in open forum during a Council meeting.

31. It appears that the legal case attorney Bilberry cites to in his letter was initiated in fall of 2015, a year after I first attended the State of Hawaii Department of Transportation meeting. Also, I do not believe attorney Bilberry was even employed by the

Department of Corporation Counsel in 2013 when the alleged public Council investigation took place. For many reasons, not the least of which is that Corporation Counsel drafted the problematic “deferral” agreements with countless private developers, I believe Corporation Counsel has no business responding to my citizen requests for disclosures which I sent directly to Council Member Couch and Council Services.

32. I believe that the letter from Mr. Bilberry and the lack of any response from Council Members Don Couch and Mike White suggest that the so-called public Council investigation in 2013, which Council Member Don Couch referred to, **never took place**. It seems clear that there was no public investigation to address the use of public funds to pay for developers’ obligations, contrary to Council Member Couch’s false representation.

33. The State of Hawaii Office of Information Practices has informed me of my citizens’ rights to file a lawsuit for access to the public records under HRS §§ 92F-15, 92F-42(1)(2101).

34. While I am prepared to file a lawsuit to compel production of the minutes, findings, and conclusions of the so-called public investigation, Article 10 of the Maui County Charter clearly states that “the board shall have the power to administer oaths, and subpoena witnesses and compel production of books and papers pertinent thereto.”

35. If I have to take court action as a private citizen, and if I am correct that no such public investigation ever took place, I will seek legal fees and costs from the County of Maui and I will ask the court for a determination on Corporation Counsel Brian Bilberry unprofessional conduct.

36. At this time, since my numerous citizen requests for proof to support Council Member Couch’s public statements have fallen on deaf ears, I hereby call upon the



Board of Ethics to perform an investigation of unethical violations of the Maui County Charter by Council Member Couch to determine his motivation to deceive the public.

37. The Board of Ethics is asked also to consider Title 18.040.020 G. of the Maui County Code which states that "Notices of Intent to Collect" shall be sent to initiate collection of the developer agreements upon commencement of funding of capital improvement project funding. (#11) I question whether this ordinance is being honored as adopted by the Maui County Council in 2010.

38. The Maui County Charter speaks to "Every payment made in violations of this Charter shall be illegal". Also, "if any County officer or employee knowingly authorizes or makes and payments or incurs any obligation in violation of the provisions of the procedures and policies established by ordinance, or takes part therein, that action shall be cause for removal from office."(#12)

39. As a taxpayer and resident of Maui County, I have a reasonable expectation of honest, transparent, and accountable County officials. I do not accept what appears to be a false, deceptive, and unethical public disclosure by Council Member Don Couch citing a complete public investigation of County agreements with private developers; agreements which appear to misuse public funds and violate the Maui County Code and the County Charter.

40. Through this complaint, I seek the assistance of the Board of Ethics to conduct a true investigation, and determine whether violations of State Sunshine laws, the tampering with government records, and violations of County ordinances and ethics have taken place by Council Member Couch.

41. On a related note that affects me directly, I request an investigation to determine if the cause of the sudden extinguishing of Phase IV of Lower Honoapiilani Road is in any way related to the uncollected and unaccounted for developer "deferral" agreements which were first discovered along this County roadway project.

Further Affiant sayeth naught.

I am deeply concerned about the amount of Maui County's unfunded pension and health care liabilities for retirees. In addition to my remarks this morning, please consider the following:

1. The unfunded liability for both retire pensions and health care = \$700 million, more than the entire county budget.
2. Actuarial assessments can be manipulated to produce an array of different outcomes based on assumptions embraced.
 - a. Did you notice that over the past 15 years the pension fund's investment return, on average, is 5.6%? This is a sufficiently long period of time to establish a rate of return that should be used for forward projections. In light of this, even the reduced 7% return on investment is unsustainable. 7% may be legally defensible based on various third party inputs, but real experience is best = 5.6%.
 - b. Asked the pension system to re-run projections based on an assumed 5.6% return on investment. You will find that the retirement system may already be in an unsalvageable death spiral.
3. Where is leadership on this critical issue from the mayor, the managing director and the finance department?
 - a. After all, this the biggest financial crisis to visit the county, perhaps ever.
 - b. If this is not addressed in the mayor's proposed budget, is that acceptable to you?
 - c. Shouldn't you return the proposed budget to the executive branch and demand leadership and co-ownership with the council + solutions?
4. Where can information about these unfunded liabilities be found on the county web site?
 - a. Why don't we have a county dashboard - particularly a dashboard of critical financial indicators?
 - b. Since we value transparency in government, this data should be readily accessible to citizens. Why isn't it?
5. When bond rating agencies understand the immensity of the county's unfunded pension and health care liabilities, our bond ratings will likely be downgraded, pushing up credit costs for the county.
 - a. Who will bear responsibility when this happens? The mayor? The council? Citizens will have to pay the price literally. Who should be held accountable?
6. Let's not lose sight of the fact that Hawaii has sunk not just to the bottom quartile of states in terms of pension funding, it is in the bottom 20%, and that was *before* the 6/30/16 disastrous results were realized.

7. Retiree pension and health care liabilities have a way of spiraling out of control if prudent oversight and control are not applied, and that is what is happening here. Hoping things will get better by tinkering around the edges will not solve a growing \$700 million problem.

8. Did you notice that increased funding proposals are stacked so that the immediate effect is lower than in out years? While this may give counties time to get ready for the balloon to come, a better explanation may be an unwillingness to call a spade a spade, thus deferring the bad news to others down the line. Those other are - us.

9. This is a crisis. Yes, it has been building over time, but the fact remains that the chickens have come home to roost. The council and executive branch own the situation and must act with speed, intelligence and courage.

10. Summary from the 2016 actuarial report:

Summary and Closing Comments

To summarize the results of the actuarial valuation of the Employees' Retirement System as of June 30, 2016, it is our opinion that if all assumptions are met going forward, the present assets plus future required contributions will be sufficient to provide the benefits specified in the law. However, the new actuarial assumptions have resulted in pushing out the year at which the plan is expected to be fully funded. Last year the ERS was expected to eliminate the unfunded liability of the System (be fully funded) in 2041 which was 26 years from the valuation date. This year's valuation shows that the ERS is expected to be fully funded in 2082, which is forty-one years later than last year (66 years from this year's valuation date).

Thus, the current contribution rates are not sufficient to eliminate the UAAL over a period of 30 years or less as specified by Hawaii Revised Statute 88-122(e)(1).

Based on our professional experience and current industry standards, 66 years is an inappropriate amount of time to allow for amortizing the current UAAL. This amount of time would push significant costs into several future generations, and does not allow for any future adverse experience that may arise. We recommend the contribution rates be increased to bring the funding period into a more appropriate range, with a target of at least 25 years.

Last year Mayor Charmaine Tavares testified before the Special Committee on Governance, stating that the County Council has tremendous power, more than the mayor. Council power is best exercised through the budget process, where it has tremendous control over county expenditures and operations, including executive branch goals.

Here are last year's goals for the mayor:

1. Provide assistance and follow up to constituents, county personnel and governmental agencies.
2. Provide nominations and staff various Boards and Commissions entities.
3. Increase in # of subscribers to the Mayor's official website and County of Maui social network sites.
4. Provide accurate press releases and official statements for media within 24-hour turnaround period.
5. Provide full support for Hawaii Conference of Mayors (HCOM) through assisting other counties' needs, improved relations with other mayors.
6. Maintain relations with the County Council by having official dialogue meetings.
7. Maintain and develop new relations with concerned officials at the federal and state-level of government.
8. Rekindle and develop relationships with International Sister Cities.
9. Digitize documents and provide correspondences via e-mail such as Mayor's incoming mail, letters, invitations, among others.
10. Conduct health and wellness-related events that promote a healthy lifestyle by implementing a Health and Wellness Policy within the County of Maui.

These goals are better suited for an administrative assistant, not for Maui County's mayor, who serves as both the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Administrative Officer for the County. Yet, the council approved these goals along with a large staff for the mayor to accomplish these low level activities. His staff included and still includes a number of former council members.

This year's proposed budget is no better. Mayor Arakawa's goals for 2018 are (see the proposed budget at pages 377-378.):

- Provide assistance to constituents with concerns or issues relating to County government.
- Develop a working relationship with news agencies and providing them information for dissemination.
- Conduct a comprehensive review of applicants for qualifications and ability to fulfill their duties as board members and commissioners.
- Recruit and attract individuals to serve on board and commissions.
- Foster relationships with government entities.

The budget also proposes a dashboard so the council and citizens can see how he is doing. The proposed dashboard indicators are (p. 370):

1. Number of communications with Sister Cities and other international governments.
2. Number of town driven activities and/or events.
3. Develop a Budget Simulator to increase citizen engagement.

None of these are even close to being acceptable goals or indicators for a CEO/COO of Maui County.

Goals for the Budget Office are similarly inadequate. Here is what is proposed, even as the county faces significant and difficult unfunded pension and health care liabilities for retirees:

- Develop a financially sound budget by improving the use and control of operating and capital budget resources.
- Provide public with budget summary or synopsis.
- Increase citizen engagement in the budget process.
- Develop, improve and/or maintain the professional skills of all employees at a high level through such activities as attendance at workshops, seminars, and conferences.

Here are the proposed dashboard indicators:

- Bond Rating of AA+ or higher
- Percent by which actual GF revenues vary from budget estimates (at FY end).
- Develop online budget simulator to increase citizen engagement.

The same criticism can be made with respect of every department in the executive branch. The council should note that many of the goals presented don't get the the big issues facing the county and are largely "process" based, not performance based.

Besides agreeing on the size of the budget and how funds should be allocated in 2018, **the Council should not approve a 2018 budget without defining appropriate goals for the executive branch to achieve as well as specifying a**

set of key dashboard indicators tied to achievement of these fundamental goals so performance can be readily assessed. We can no longer afford to just float along.

Dear Committee Members,

We own a home in Lahaina that is licensed for short term rentals. License number STWM 2013/0002. Please know- it will never be a long term rental because of it's location, cost and our use of our home.

We lived on Maui full time for many years and now no longer can.

I am writing to provide testimony and respectfully ask that you keep the tax classification for STRH's as "Commercial" and not "Hotel".

The commercial tax rate is 22.2% higher than residential zoning and 140% higher than the homeowner rate. A hotel classification would add another 34% to the cost of property taxes. We feel that it is "fair" and reasonable to pay the higher "commercial" rate to be able to offer short term rentals some of the time but unfair to pay a hotel rate without benefiting from many of the use rights that hotels have and STRH's don't.

A hotel zoning allows much more density and many more units per acre to generate revenue and split operational costs. They also have many other sources of revenue than short term rental homes (STRH) do not have, such as restaurants, bars, retail space rentals, parking revenue, weddings, conventions and entertainment revenues. All generate major revenue. A STRH can't have more than 2 people per bedroom stay in the home or even visit the home at any time. It also has no option for revenue from the many sources that hotels enjoy as listed above.

As you know, in the past Maui County was concerned about vacation rentals being un-licensed and un-regulated. They encouraged homeowners to obtain licenses. We were among the first to apply and among the first to obtain a license. The licensing procedure took a great deal of time, effort and expense. Once licensed, we began paying an annual license fee, higher (Commercial) property taxes and higher expenses. This is an economic benefit to the people of Maui.

However, those who remain un- licensed don't pay these expenses or add this revenue to Maui. Further increasing the tax classification to "Hotel" without the benefits of Hotel zoning is unfair and penalizes those of us who comply with the rules.

Being licensed for short term rentals has not increased the value of our property, in fact it may reduce the value. If we sold our home a new owner would not be able to rent short term without receiving a new permit. (Now— Some have proposed not allowing anyone who has NOT owned the home for 5 years from applying for a permit) A new owner or our children could not operate or even legally honor our rental commitments, some of which go out 1 + year in advance. People's plans can be ruined and they can be charged many fees.

This would make it likely impossible for our children to inherit our home or prevent a purchaser from buying our home if we sold someday because they could not extend the permit.

Please don't change the tax classification!

Renting our home allows us to generate some revenue to help with expenses while still allowing us and our family to stay and enjoy our home when we are back on Maui, which is as often as we can!

Our expenses are considerable (Over \$130,000.00 in expenses last year that mostly stays on Maui- supporting Maui families) and we have a very positive impact on the local economy. Even higher taxes would be unfair and reduce rentals on Maui as costs would have to be passed to paying visitors who have many other vacation options and destinations to go to and may or will go to. Mexico, Costa Rica, Bahamas etc

We did the right thing and applied for and received a permit, at the County's request, unlike people who rent illegally to this day. This means that we collect and remit the 13.42% T.A.T and G.E.T. tax to the State and pay our annual license fees to the County and the higher- commercial tax rate to the County. All added revenue to Maui. A further rate increase without all the "hotel zoning" benefits would be unfair and costly to Maui and it's people.





Honorable Members of the Council:

I am writing to urge your in support of Mayor Arakawa's FY2018 budget request for Maui Nui Botanical Gardens. Although I live on the Big Island, I visit the Maui Nui Botanical Garden (MNBG) almost every time I am on your isle. I received a State Forest Stewardship Grant almost 10 years ago to restore the native forest here in Volcano on a 7 acre parcel, and I have kept alien invasive plant species down to well less than 5% of the vegetation cover. I also "outplant" rare species that naturally occur in this area, to fill in the "light gaps" where the weeds were. I have had several interested groups of restoration enthusiasts here to see what I have done. They all need sources of propagative material of native plants to restore their native forests, and I know you have residents on Maui with the same needs and desires to restore native forest. It is an increasingly popular movement.

On Maui, MNBG provides such propagative material to the public (via plant sales) for 3 different islands, to complete the restoration process by adding back both the common and rare native species. They supply Threatened and Endangered propagative material to nonprofit and State forest restoration projects, free plants to schools for planting, and over 1,000 plants were given away last Arbor day. I know from experience that some can be quite hard to grow. However, your MNBG staff are experts at that and they are an invaluable resource found nowhere else in Maui Nui and they work for the benefit of all of Maui Nui. There are several other services MNBG provides to residents that I am sure others will bring up in letters of support.

To understand the community support for the Garden, you need only to show up on a volunteer work day to see how much time volunteers put into maintaining the Garden and how enthusiastic they all are. Maui Nui Botanical Garden is indeed a community resource in every sense of the phrase.

Lastly, I might add that the staff is quite good at attracting other funds by leveraging your ongoing support with matching dollars and grants to support their work. Mahalo nui for your MNBG support over the years, so let's keep that up!

We wish to voice our strong opposition to the proposed 18 cent per gallon increase in the County of Maui biodiesel fuel tax. Maui Disposal operates 40 trucks using biodiesel fuel daily. These trucks burn an average of 4 gallons per hour for 10 hours per day, 6 days per week. The

18 cent increase would increase our monthly fuel bill by approximately \$7,400 per month or \$88,800 per year. We will be forced to pass on the increase to our customers.

In addition, our annual County landfill fees would increase by over \$1,029,000 if the proposed 19.8% landfill increase is passed (\$91 to \$109 per ton including the \$10 per ton recycling fee.) We would be forced to pass the \$1,029,000 along with the increase in the biodiesel fuel tax to our customers. One of our Company goals is to increase the recycling rate on Maui, but the increase in the biodiesel fuel tax blunts our recycling efforts and penalizes us and our customers financially.

We urge you to not allow the increases in the biodiesel fuel tax and County landfill fees.

My name is Sheila Dean, resident of Kula, Maui. I have lived on Maui my entire life, except for the years I attended college. I am writing to express my concern about the mayor's proposed budget increases. My first issue is his proposed increase in residential refuse collection. An increase in monthly fees may force some families to discontinue this service because of the additional costs. However, with the Mayor's proposal, this same family would need to take their household garbage to the landfill. In his proposal, he wants to charge \$3 per vehicle to use the landfill. It seems to me that Mayor Arakawa's proposals would negatively impact our community. There WILL be an increase of illegal dumping around the island. Furthermore, families may choose to hold on to their garbage until they have a full truck load to take to the landfill since each vehicle may be charged \$3. This can potentially create unsanitary conditions and health hazards. Furthermore, if someone cannot afford the \$72 increase in refuse collection fees per year and that same person doesn't have a vehicle to transport household garbage to the landfill, what other alternatives will that person have? If the landfill service is free, at least that person can seek help from friends or neighbors who may already be going to the dump that week. However, when there's a fee, it makes it a little more difficult for that person to ask for assistance. Maui is already ridiculously expensive! Don't tack on additional fees to basic services that our citizens need.

My 2nd issue is his proposal to close Waiehu Municipal Golf Course. First of all, I don't golf and I have no desire to play the game of golf. My frustration with this proposal is that our county has ONE municipal golf course where our youth can learn the sport for a reasonable fee. Our island has many beautiful, world-class courses. However, for the majority of our local children, their families won't be able to financially support their interest in the sport if their only option is to use a private golf facility. Additionally, many local retirees on our island enjoy playing golf in Waiehu. After years of paying their fair share of taxes, they finally have the time to enjoy our only county course. Unfortunately, with the mayor's proposal, current and aspiring local golfers will need to either quit the sport, dish out more funds to play at the private courses, or start hitting balls from their back yards or at local parks!!! We definitely don't want to see option 3 become a reality!



My name is Sydney Smith, I'm the current president of Maui Coffee Association and a member of the Ag Working Group.

Thank you for adjusting your busy schedules to bring County Government to the community.

While every year is a challenge if you're a farmer or rancher, this past year has been especially so.

Little Fire Ant, Coffee Berry Borer, Rat Lung Disease carrying slugs, and now a drought declaration after a fall and early winter plagued with floods.

This past year we lost our biggest farm with the closure of HC&S. there are lots more changes to come.

Despite all that, I feel hopeful. With the help of the Council under the leadership of Don Guzman and now Yuki Lei Sugimura I think we're very close to getting the Planning Department, Real Property Tax Division and the Water Department to agree on a single definition of Agriculture. I think we're close to getting electronic filing of a single farm plan for our entire farm or ranch. That will be a huge time-saver for us and will save the County money by streamlining the whole process. There's just no reason for all the departments to be duplicating the work and stretching their personnel so thin if one department could share their work with the others.

And maybe, maybe, this will be the year we get an AgTourism ordinance at long last. AgTourism is embraced the world over as a necessary component of a healthy Ag community. Given our economic engine here, it's one of the most important policy decisions you can make this coming year to save family farms.

It looks like the State Legislature has approved the sale of revenue bonds to support the expansion of MauiGrown Coffee. That could double or triple the size of that farm and that would help other Maui coffee farmers who would be able to utilize the MauiGrown mill. MauiGrown has always been extremely supportive of all coffee farmers here in Maui. Converting former sugar cane land to sustainable coffee orchards is something I think everyone can get behind.

The grant we receive from the The Mayor's Office of Economic Development has helped to promote 100% Maui Coffee to the world. Our Maui coffees consistently have the highest average score of any of the 8 Hawaiian Coffee Districts. And this July we will host the Hawaii Statewide Coffee Conference in conjunction with our 10th Annual Seed to Cup Coffee Festival.

Agriculture, if managed correctly and with support from the community can thrive. Thank you for your continued support for diversified agriculture.

Aloha Honorable Council Members,

Request Council authorize and schedule the tax-exemption noted in Maui County Code §3.48.520 – Alternate energy improvements. Property tax exemption is incentive to property owners implementing alternate-renewable energy generating systems connected to MECO grid to benefit all Maui electric power consumers. Provides opportunities reducing impacts of fossil fuel costs upon Maui through reducing rate costs following infrastructure improvements accommodating increasing amounts of alternate-renewable power placed on grid.

How funding Maui County Code §3.48.520 – Alternate energy improvements? Maui County alternate-renewable energy tax-exempting credits can be funded partially from County gained savings resulting from County implemented energy conserving and alternate-renewable generating initiatives. Beginning 2010, ten county 24/7/365 operated fire stations outfitted with efficient energy consuming appliances and photovoltaic arrays generating at least \$500,000. energy savings!

- Portion of savings should be reinvested toward making other county facilities energy efficient and generate alternate-renewable energy.
- A portion of savings should be incentives for property owners installing alternate-renewable energy generating systems providing power to grid.
- Another portion would be directed toward upgrading high-volume pumps featuring variable speed and highly efficient electric motor/control systems.

Benefits for resourcing natural alternative energy generating systems. Increasing uses of alternate-renewable power increases monies available on Maui; reduces exporting Maui monies abroad and increases Maui self-sustaining opportunities.

Recommend new County energy use concept/policy. County implemented renewable generating and energy conserving, increases reinvesting in alternate-renewable power generation, further lowering County operating costs and County sharing savings with property owners.

• **MCC §3.48.520 - Alternate energy improvements.**

A.

As used in this section, "alternate energy improvement" means any construction or addition, alteration, modification, improvement, or repair work undertaken upon or made to any building which results in:

The production of energy from a source, or uses a process which does not use fossil fuels, nuclear fuels or geothermal source. Such energy source may include but shall not be limited to solid wastes, wind, solar, or ocean waves, tides, or currents. Alternate energy production or energy byproducts transferred, marketed, or sold on a commercial basis shall not qualify for exemption under the provisions of this section. Provided further, that alternate energy improvements used primarily for personal consumption and producing excess energy incidental to personal consumption may transfer, market, or sell such excess energy produced and continue to qualify for the exemption provided for by the provisions of this section; however, the transfer, marketing, or sale shall be limited to less than twenty-five percent of the total energy output produced by such improvements. Nuclear fission and geothermal energy sources shall be excused from the provisions of this section; or

2.

An increase level of efficiency in the utilization of energy produced by fossil fuels or in the utilization of secondary forms of energy dependent upon fossil fuels for its generation.

B.

The value of all improvements in the county (not including a building or its structural components, except where alternate energy improvements are incorporated into the building and then only that part of the building necessary to such improvement) actually used for an alternate energy improvement shall be exempted from the measure of the taxes imposed by this chapter.

C.

Application for the exemption provided by this section shall be made with the director of finance on or before December 31st, preceding the tax year for which the exemption is claimed, except that no claim need be filed for the exemption of solar water collectors, heaters, heat pumps and similar devices.

D.

The director of finance may require the taxpayer to furnish reasonable information in order that he may ascertain the validity of the claim for exemption made under this section and may adopt rules and regulations to implement this section.

(Ord. 1344 § 1, 1983; Ord. 1076 § 3 (part), 1980; prior code § 6-1.82)

MCC §3.48.520 – Alternate energy improvements authorizes property taxpayer receiving a alternate-renewable energy tax exemption for sharing generated renewable energy from property. Property owners provide electric power to grid through a renewable generator. As written, MCC §3.48.520 lacks energy policy and funding means for County awarded renewable-alternate energy tax exemptions.
