WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

 Any Middle or High School student on Maui, Molokai, and Lanai enrolled in school as of August 15, 2020.

POSSIBLE SUBJECTS

- Healthcare: personal protective equipment (PPE) design, testing, tracing, monitoring of people, quarantine enforcement, quarantine accommodations, and new medical equipment
- Research and Technology: drones, robotics, converting salt water to fresh water
- Sustainable Food Supply: aquaponics, hydroponics, or new farming and marketing technologies
- Culture and the Arts: virtual venues to share the local experience beyond Hawaii
- Social Services: childcare, adult care, and delivery services
- Government Innovation: improve access to services via telecommunications and provide services more efficiently
- Affordable Housing: new techniques, innovative designs, new materials

- Create well-paying jobs with opportunities for advancement
- Generate revenues that will stay in Hawaii
- Promote a clean, safe, and culturally compatible environment for Hawaii

- Who is your target customer?
- How will you generate revenue?
- What expenses do you anticipate?
